A revised final draft of the [2007-2011 TIP](#) will be made available next Tuesday, June 21st for public review and comment. The TIP is a short range transportation program. Its main purpose is to identify projects which request federal funding in the near future.



In addition, the [Conformity Determination of the 2007-2011 TIP and the 2004 Baltimore Regional Transportation Plan](#) will also be available. This document looks at the impact of transportation projects included in the near term and planned for the long term on the region's air quality.

These documents are also on the BMC web site, as well as at the Regional Information Center.
