**BALTIMORE REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION BOARD
RESOLUTION #08-19**

**RESOLUTION TO ENDORSE APPLICATIONS FOR FEDERAL ASSISTANCE
THROUGH THE
CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board (BRTB) is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region, encompassing the Baltimore Urbanized Area, and includes official representatives of the cities of Annapolis and Baltimore, the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Harford, and Howard, and the Maryland Department of Transportation, the Maryland Department of the Environment, and the Maryland Department of Planning; and

WHEREAS, in 1990, Congress amended the Clean Air Act (CAA) to bolster America's efforts to attain the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). The amendments required further reductions in the amount of permissible tailpipe emissions, initiated more stringent control measures in areas that still failed to attain the NAAQS (nonattainment areas), and provided for a stronger, more rigorous linkage between transportation and air quality planning.; and

WHEREAS, the Baltimore region is a moderate nonattainment area for the 8-hour ozone NAAQS, nonattainment for the fine particulate matter standard, and in a maintenance phase for the carbon monoxide standard; and

WHEREAS, the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) Improvement Program, jointly administered by the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), was reauthorized in 2005 under the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU). The SAFETEA-LU CMAQ program provides over \$8.6 billion dollars in funds to State Departments of Transportation, Metropolitan Planning Organizations, and transit agencies to invest in projects that reduce criteria air pollutants regulated from transportation-related sources over a period of five years (2005-2009).; and

WHEREAS, the Maryland Department of Transportation has allocated one million dollars in CMAQ funds to the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board to solicit and implement emission reduction projects in the Baltimore region for state fiscal year 2008 funding; and

WHEREAS, on October 23, 2007 the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region approved the

competitive selection process for the use of Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality funding in the Baltimore region and opened the application process in October 30, 2007 and closed it on December 28, 2007. Applications were reviewed by a Technical Evaluation Group and recommendations were compiled by a CMAQ Subcommittee; and

WHEREAS, under the Board's first competitive selection process to fund CMAQ projects, the CMAQ Subcommittee is providing the attached list of recommended projects, along with their recommended funding levels.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board will work cooperatively with the Maryland Department of Transportation, the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration to initiate the attached list of projects for funding under the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program.

I HEREBY CERTIFY that the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region approved the aforementioned resolution at its March 25, 2008 meeting.
