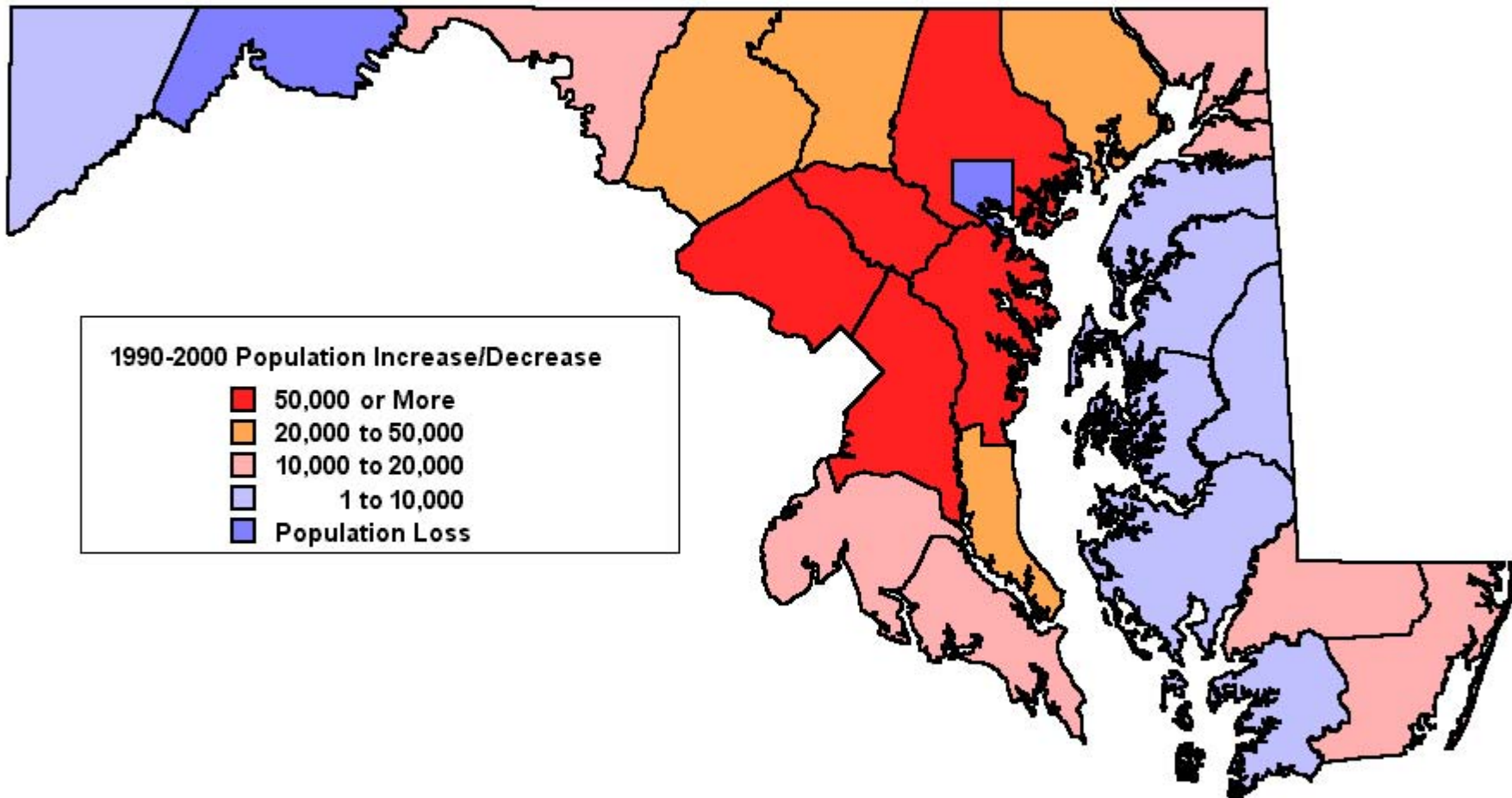

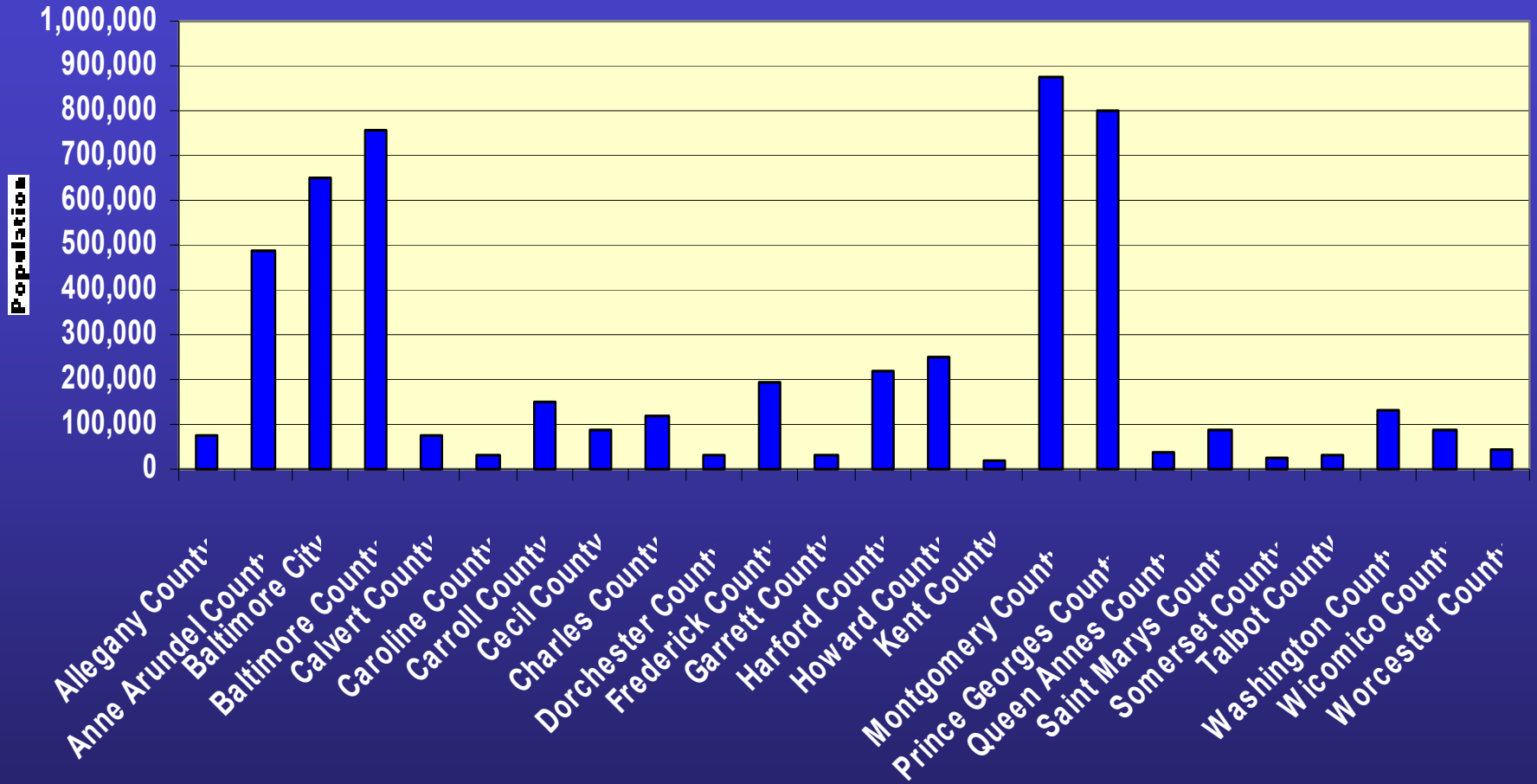

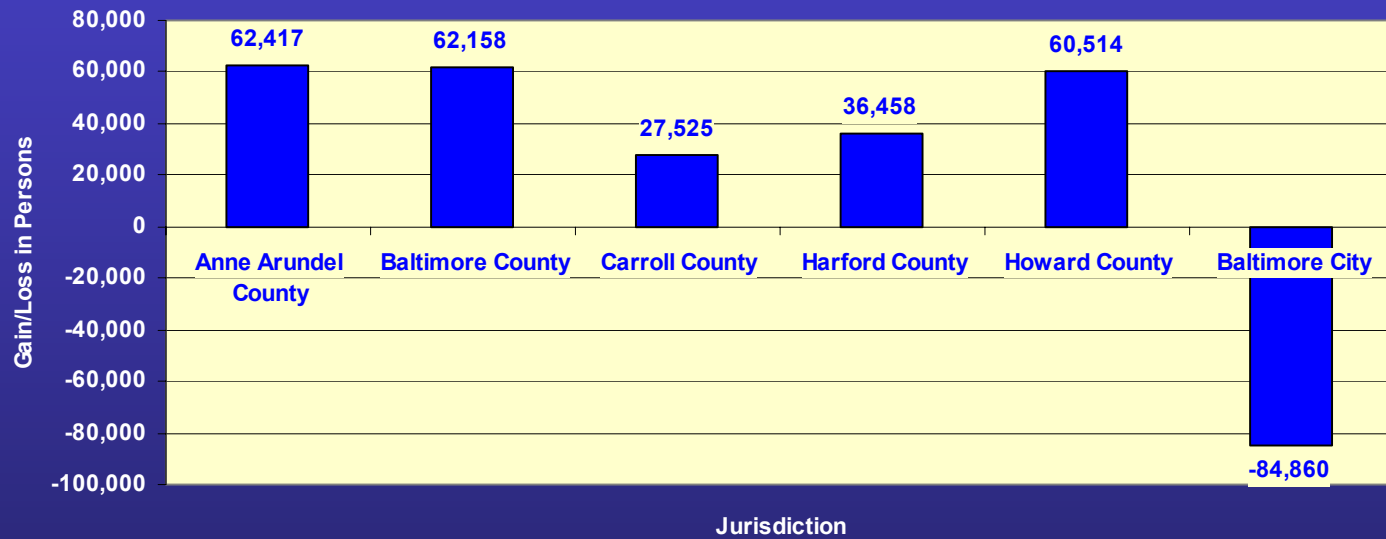
# 2000 Population by Jurisdiction



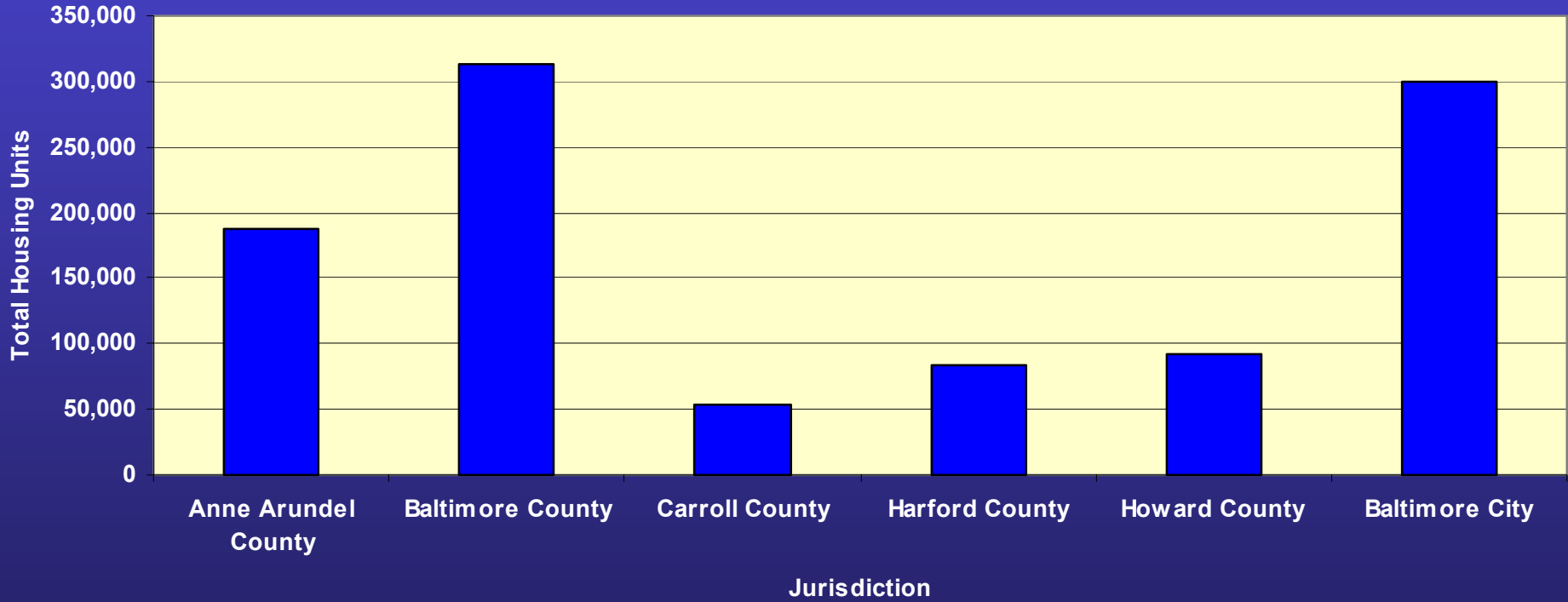
## 2000 Total Population in the Baltimore Region



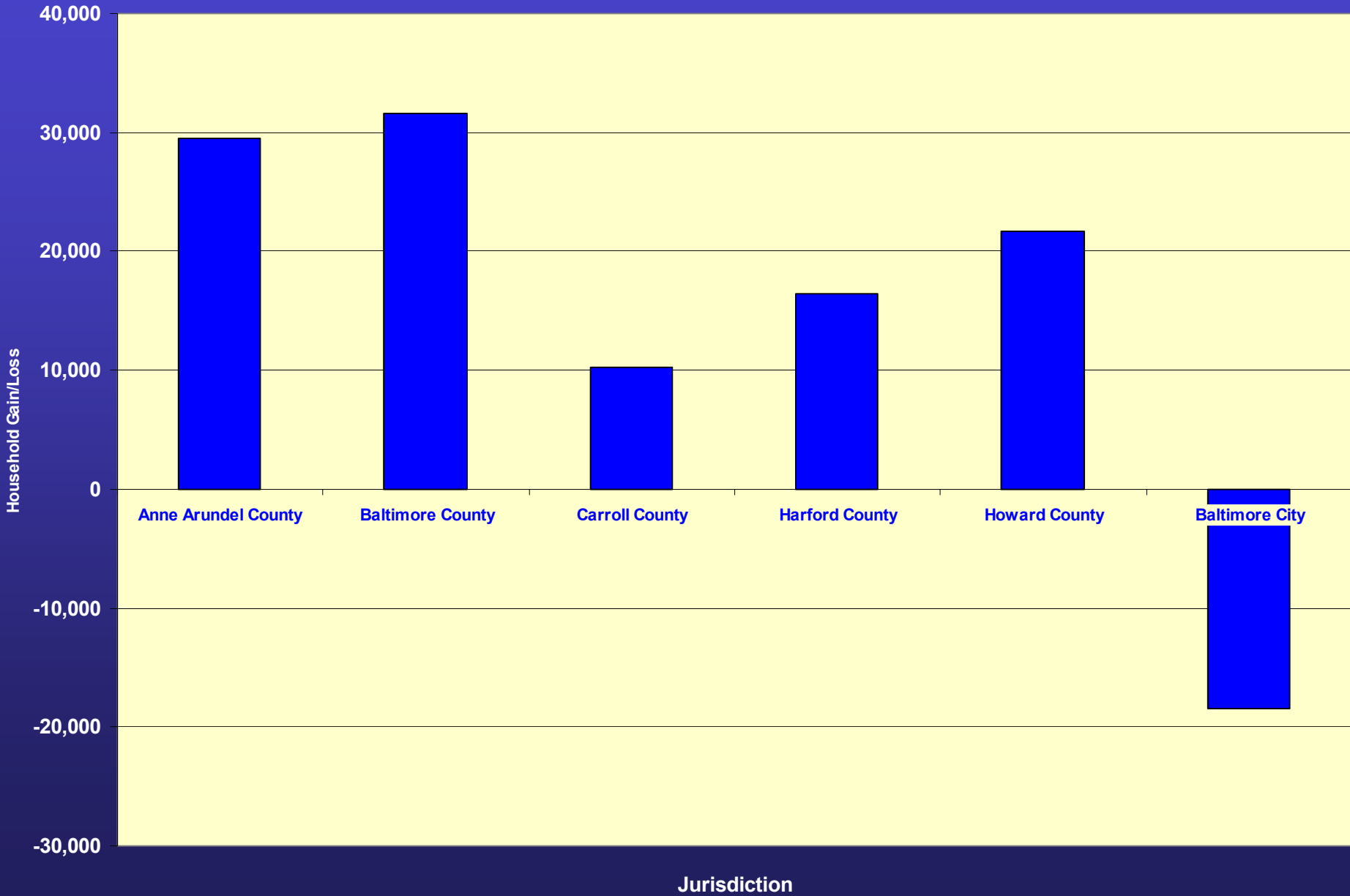
## 1990-2000 Population Change in the Baltimore Region



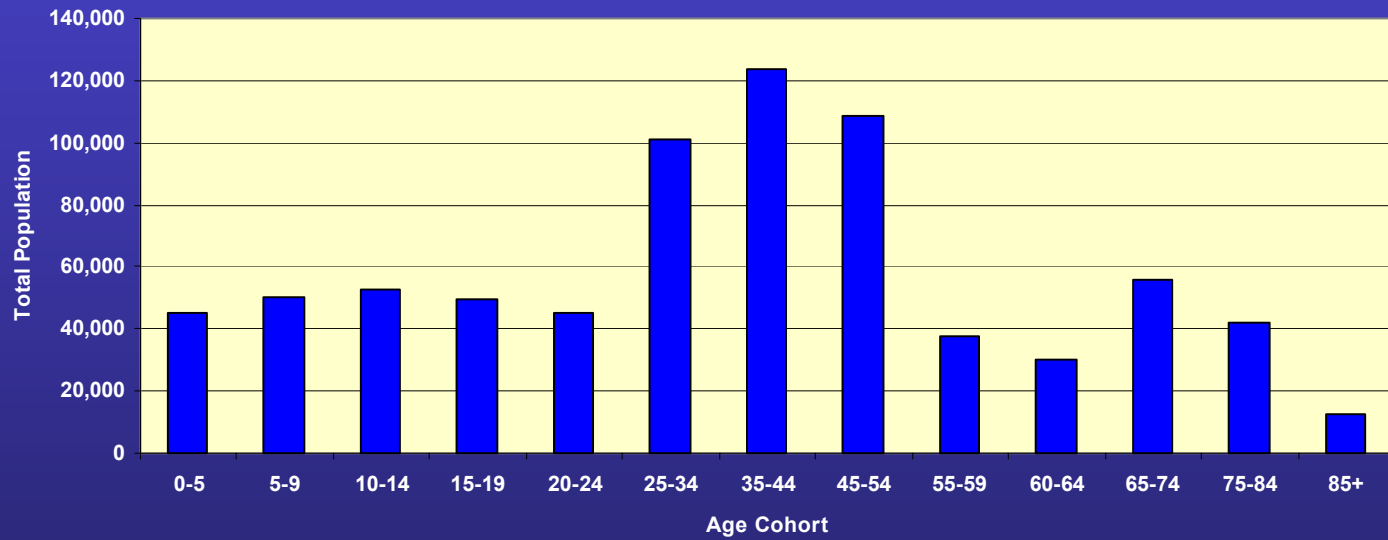
## 2000 Housing Units in the Baltimore Region

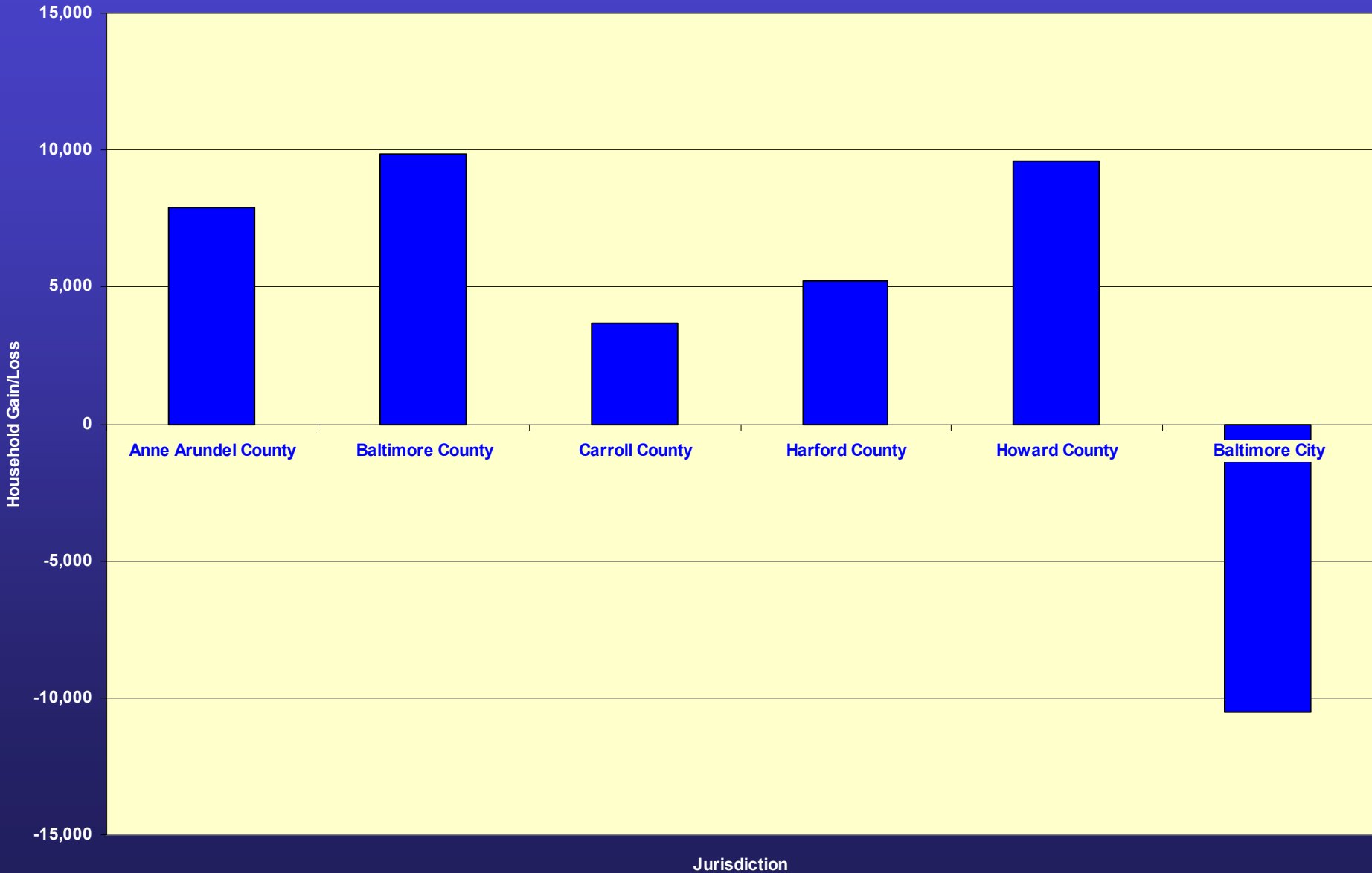

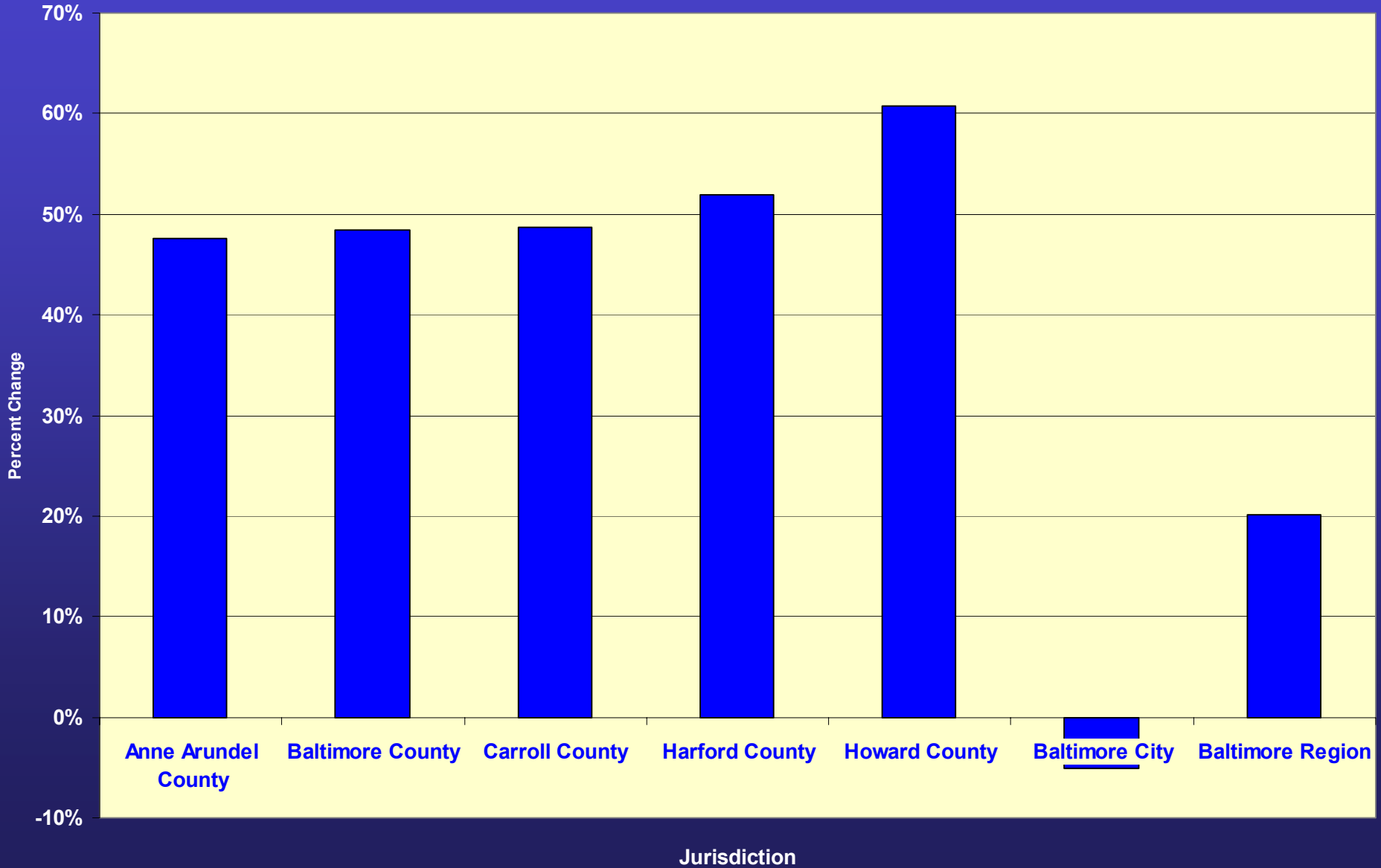

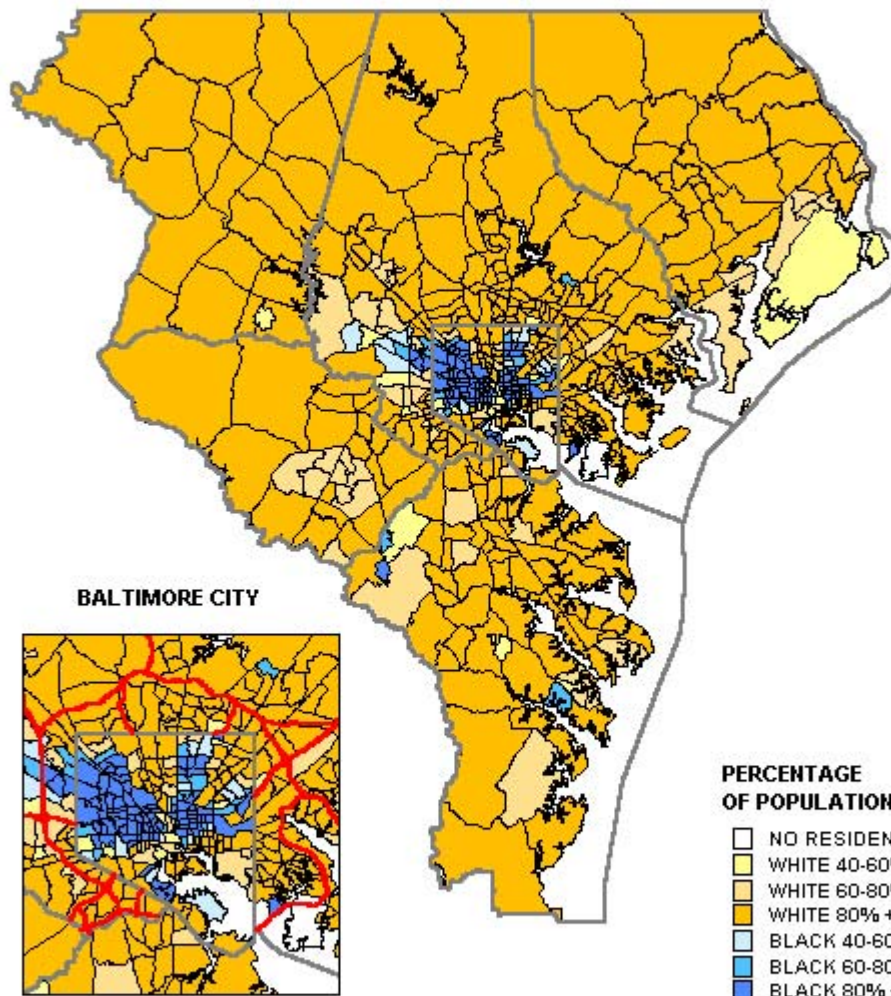

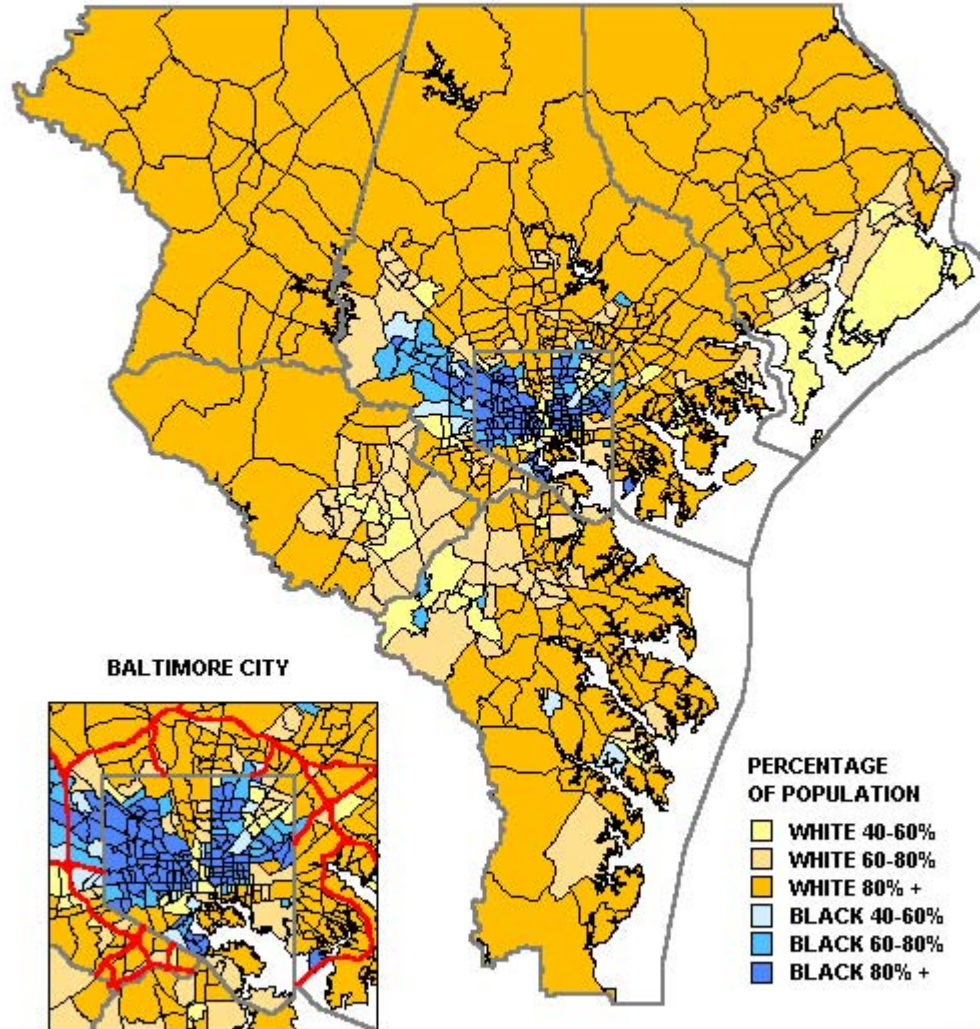

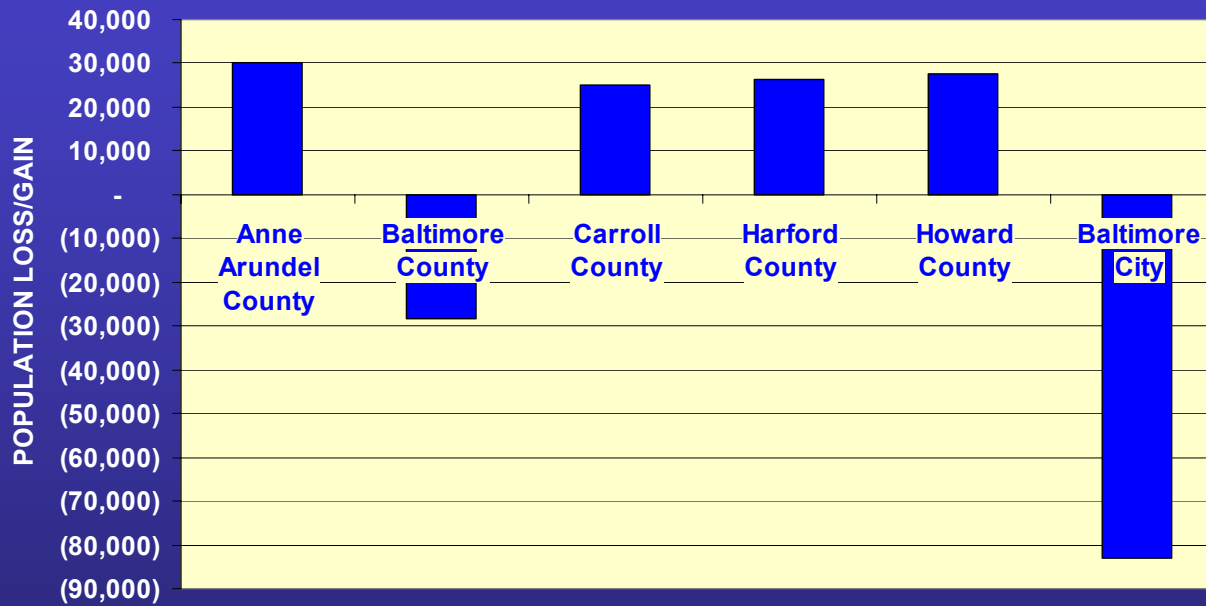

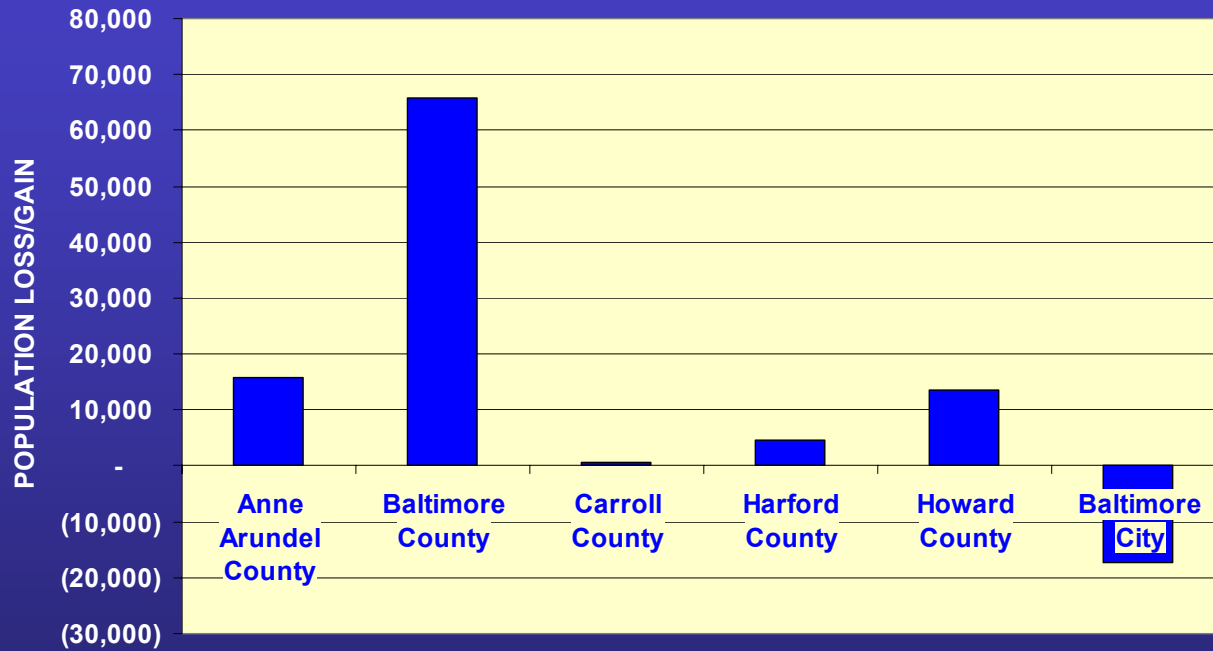

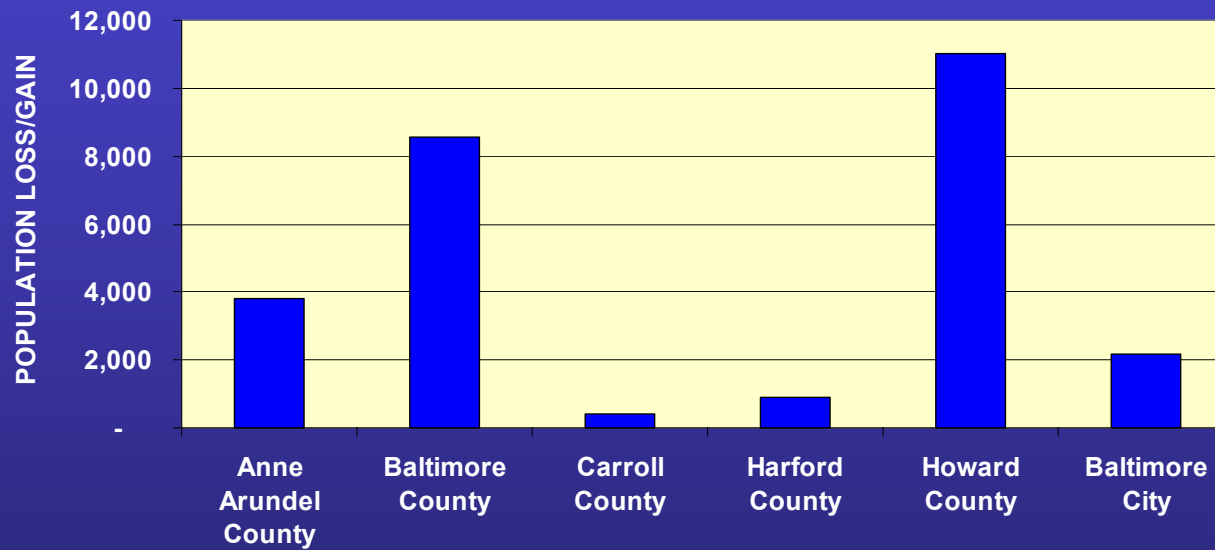
## White Population Growth in the Baltimore Region, 1990- 2000



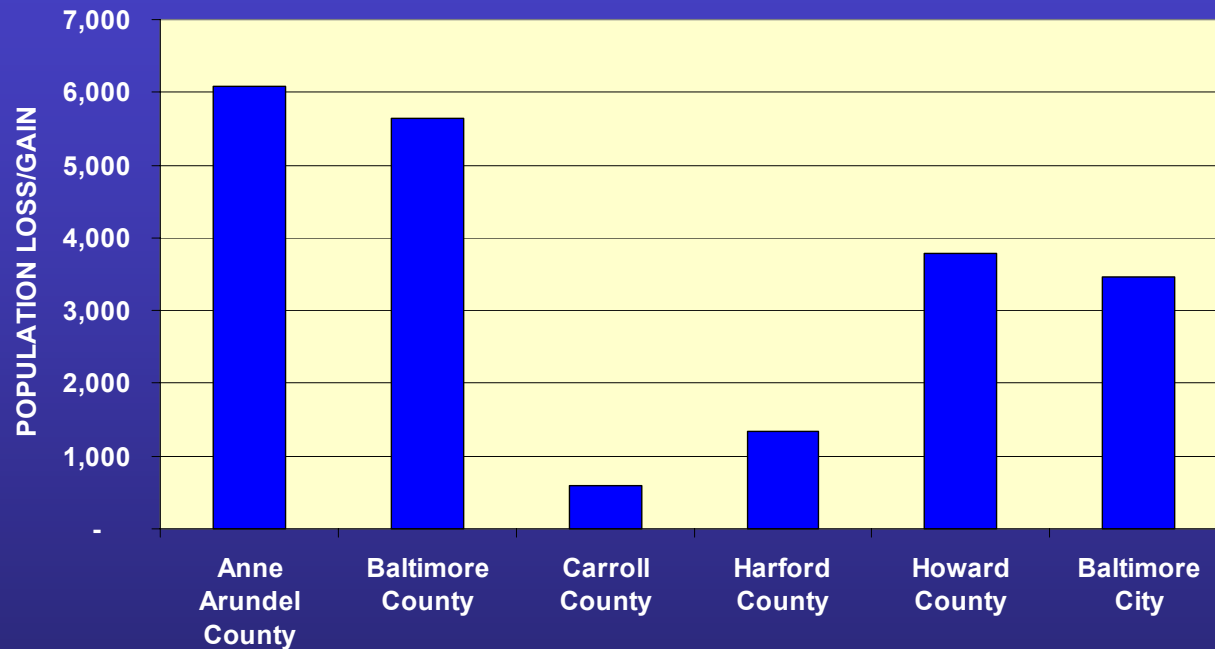
## Black Population Growth in the Baltimore Region, 1990- 2000



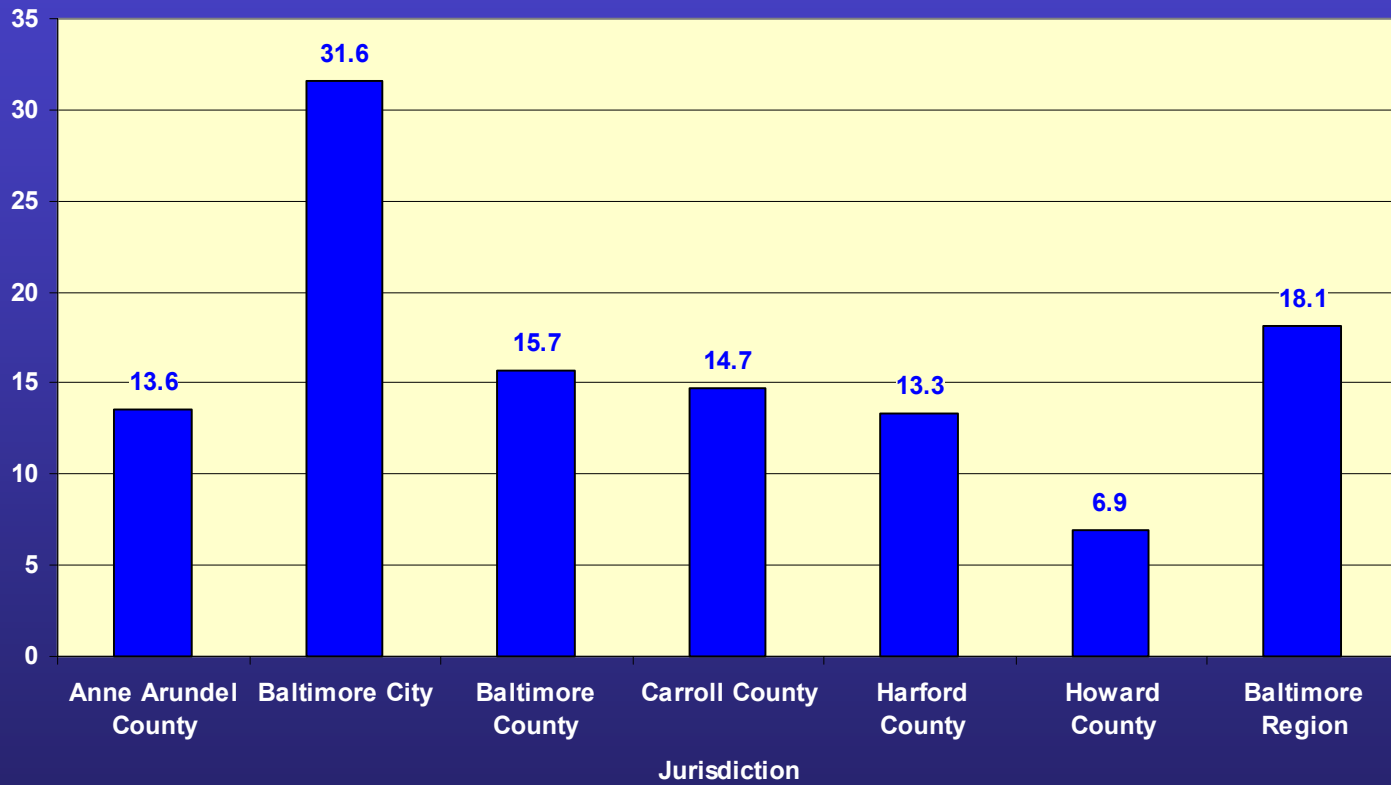
## Asian and Pacific Islander Population Growth in the Baltimore Region, 1990-2000



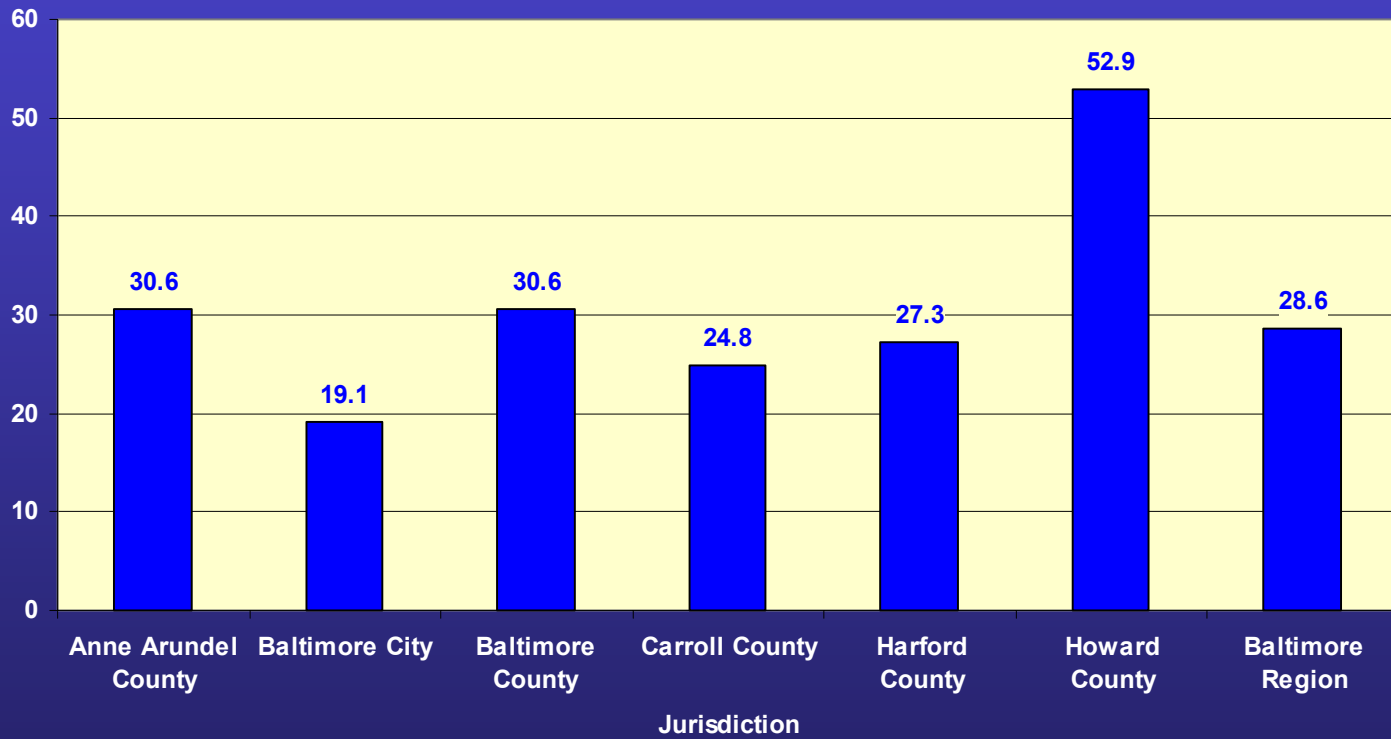
## Latino Population Growth in the Baltimore Region, 1990- 2000



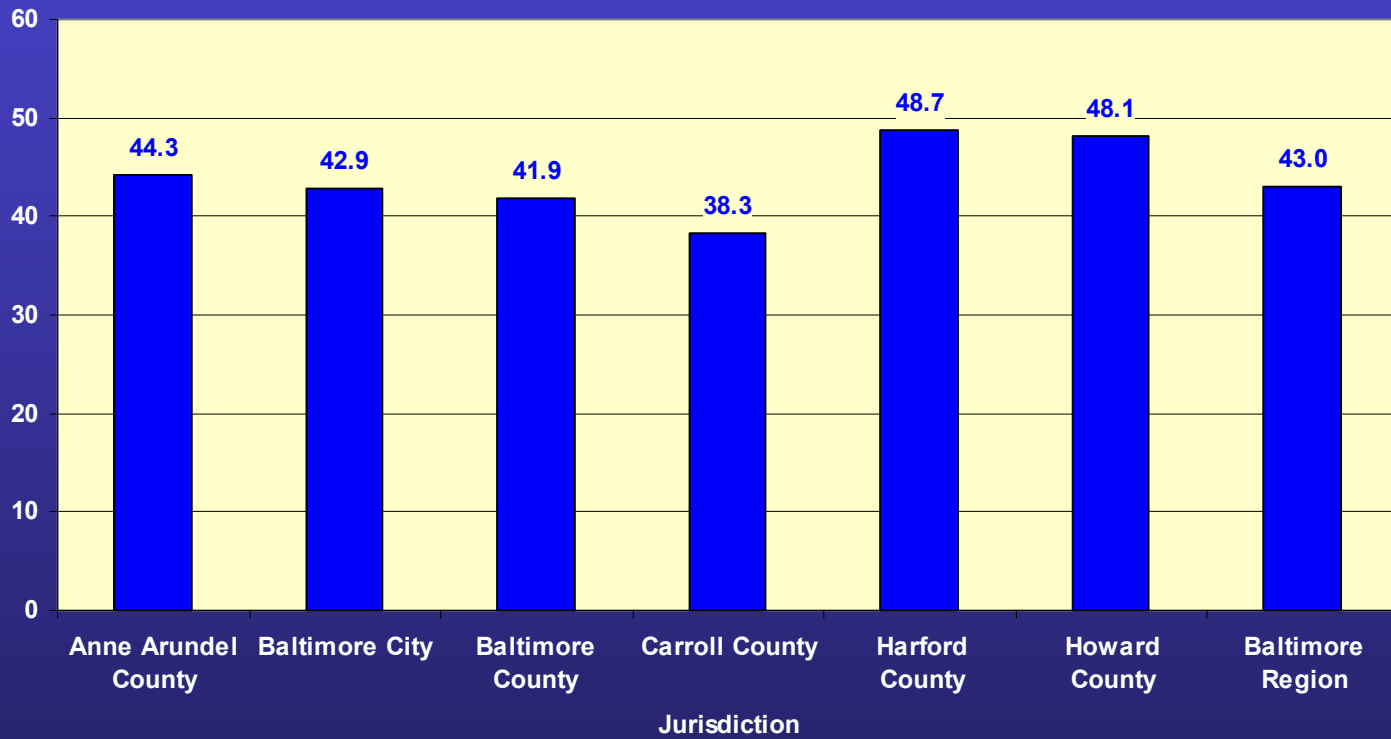
## Percent of 2000 Population 25+ without a High School Diploma



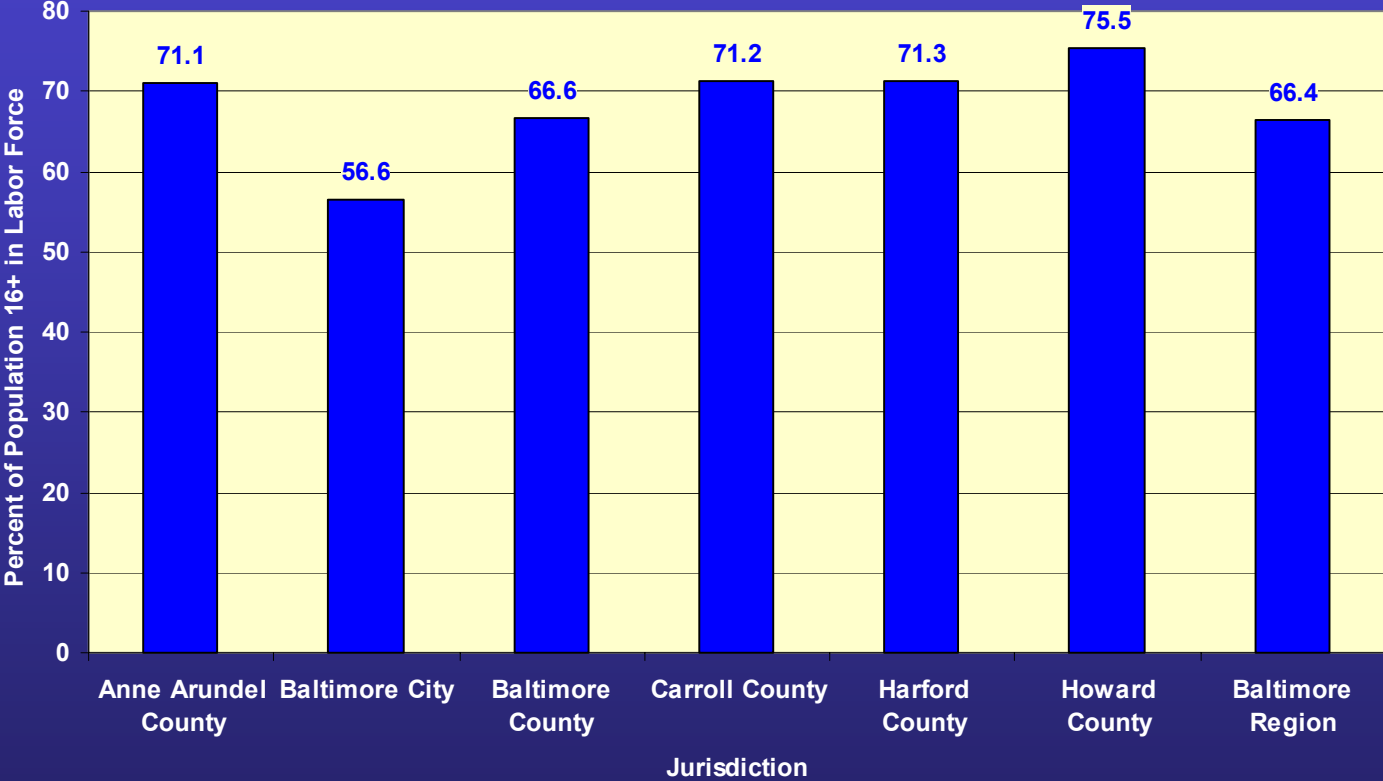
## Percent of 2000 Population 25+ with Bachelor's Degree or Higher



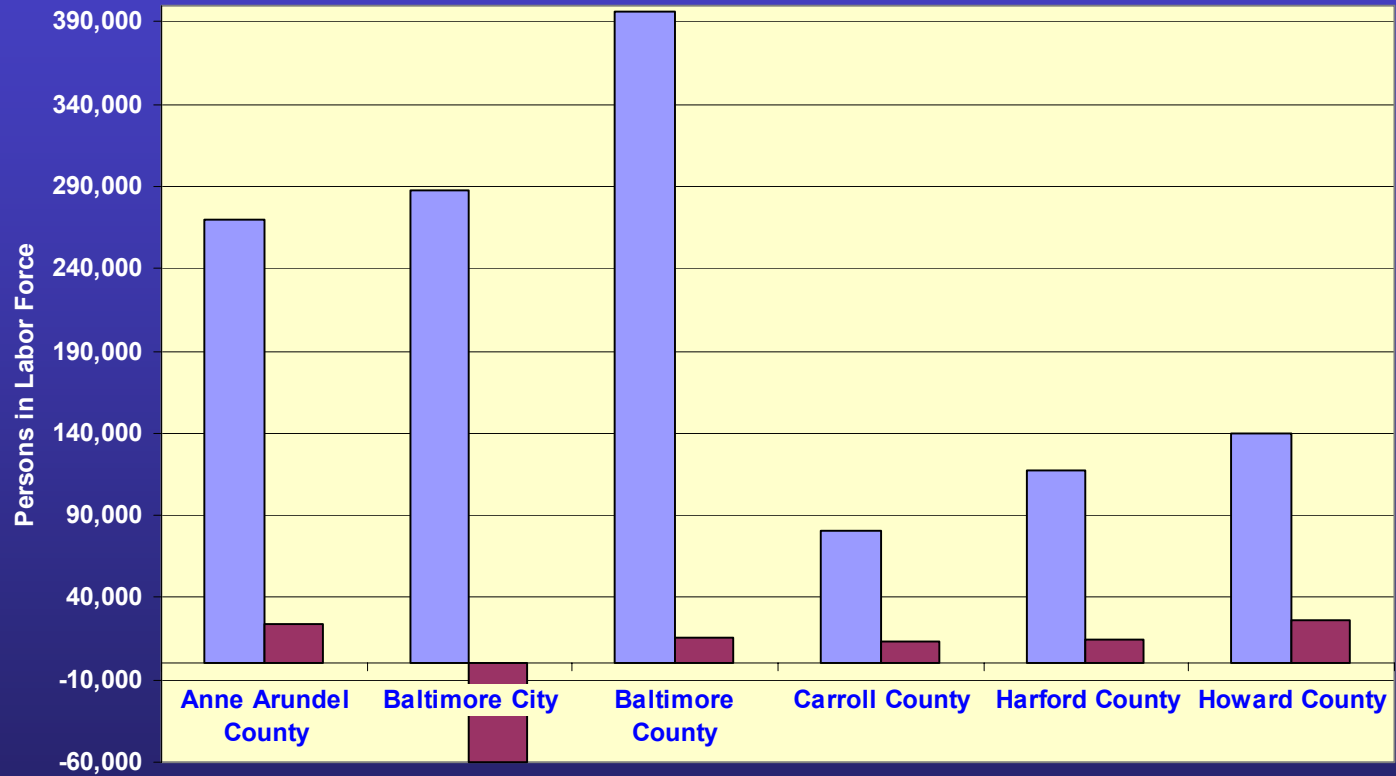
## Percent of 2000 Population 5+ Who Moved Between 1995 and 2000



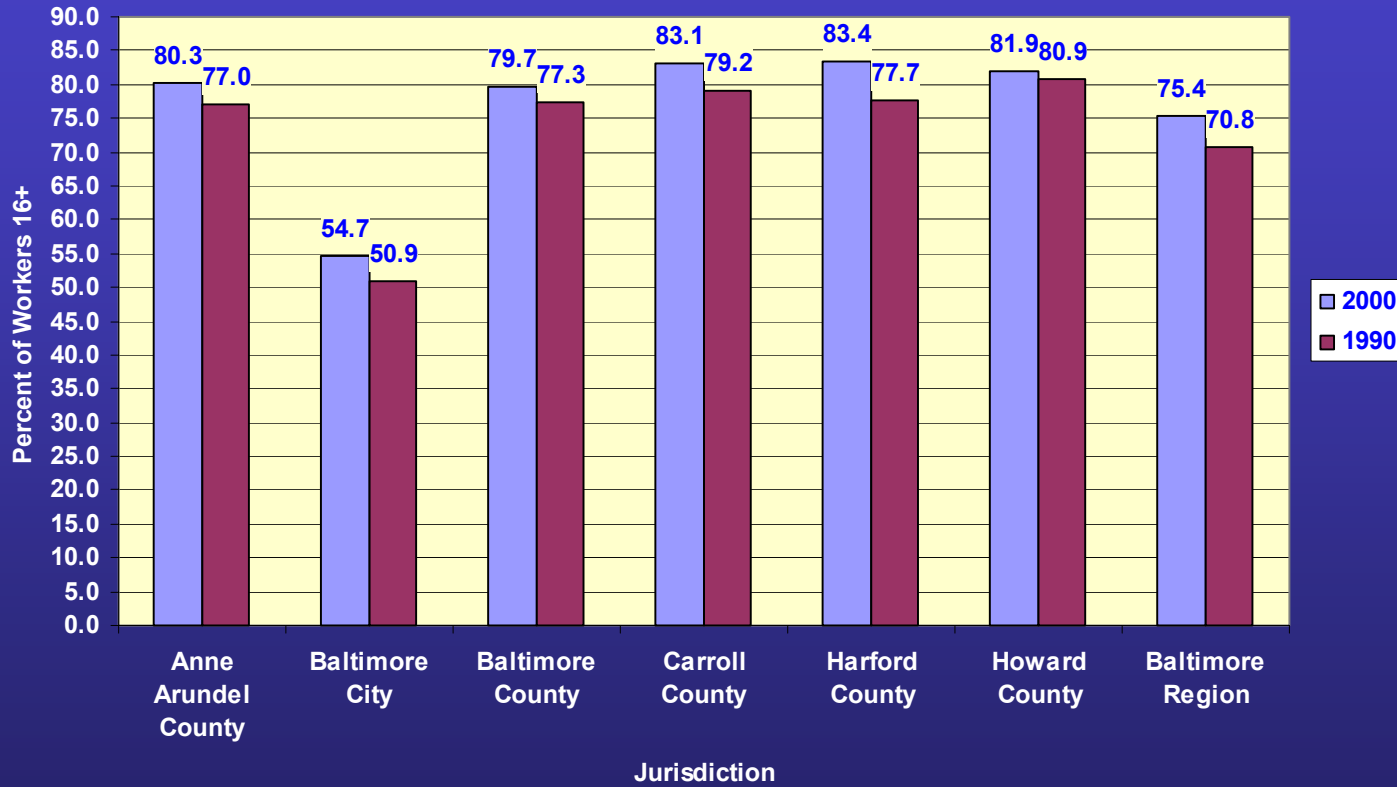
# 2000 Labor Force Participation Rate



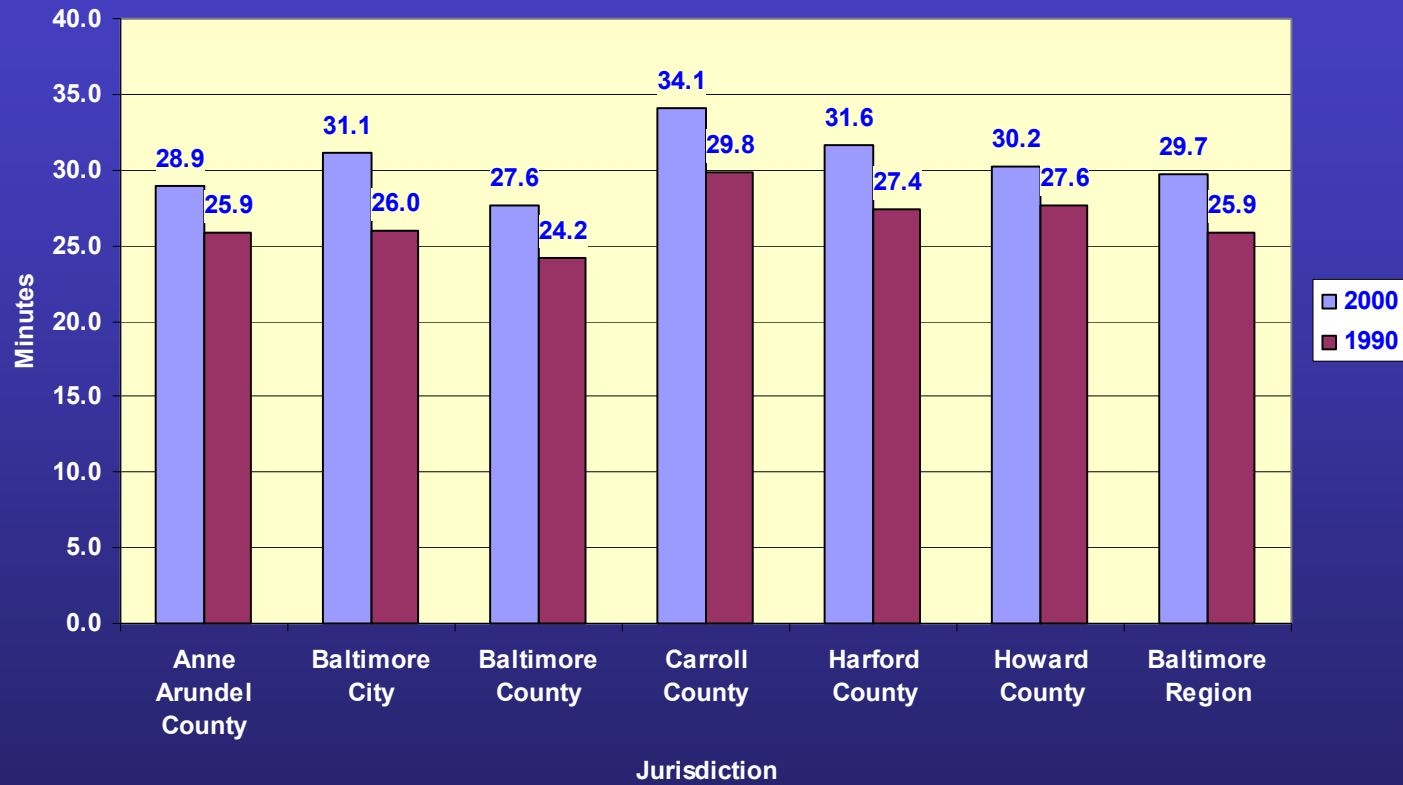
## 2000 Total Labor Force and 1990-2000 Labor Force Change



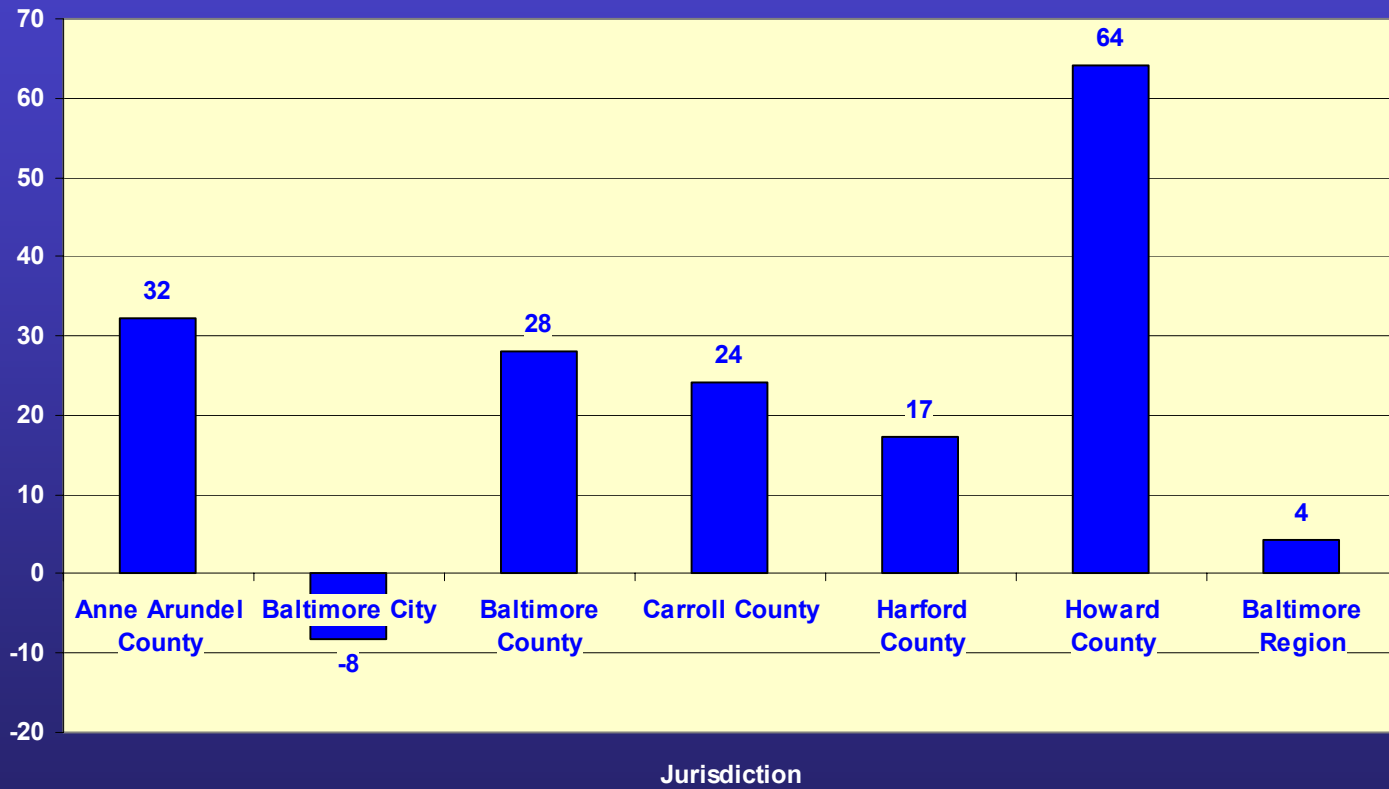
### Commutation - Workers Driving Alone, 1990 and 2000



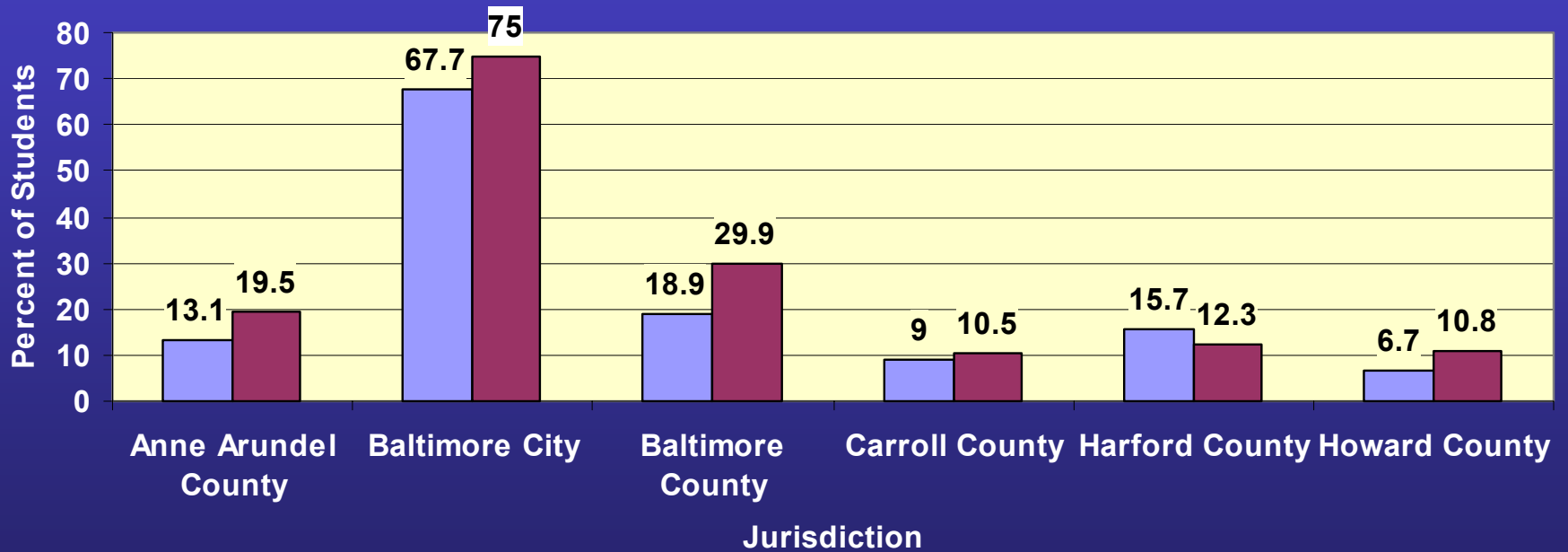
## Average Travel Time to Work, 1990 and 2000

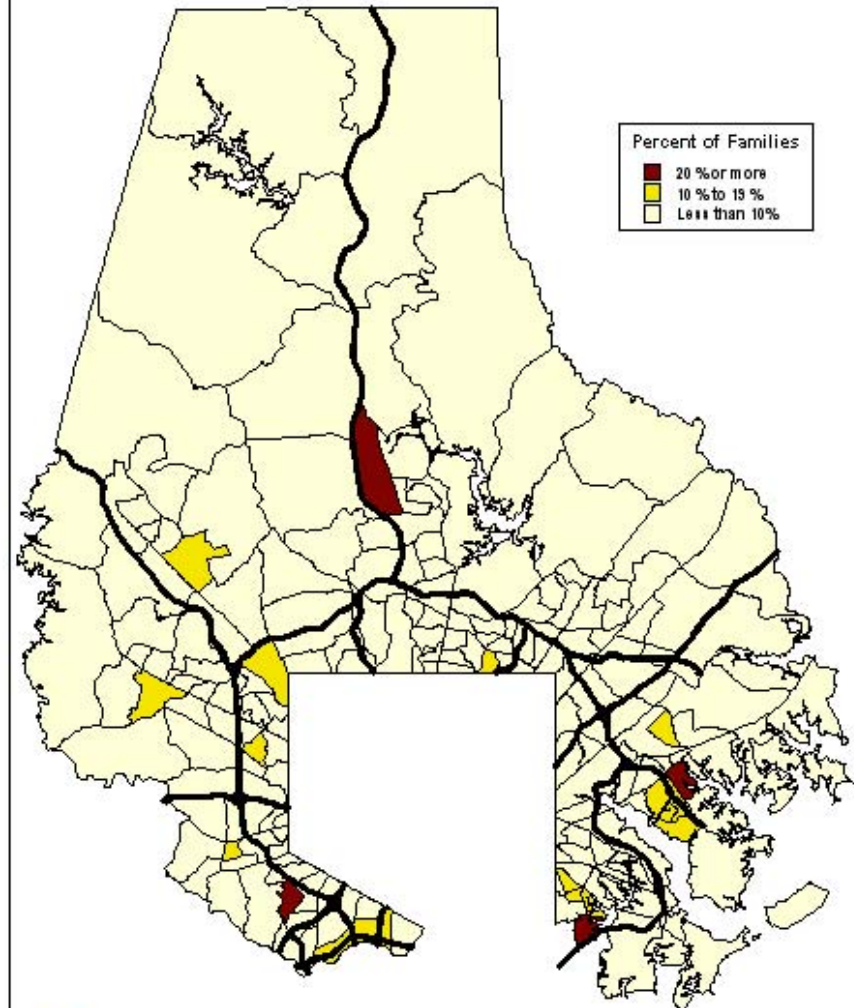

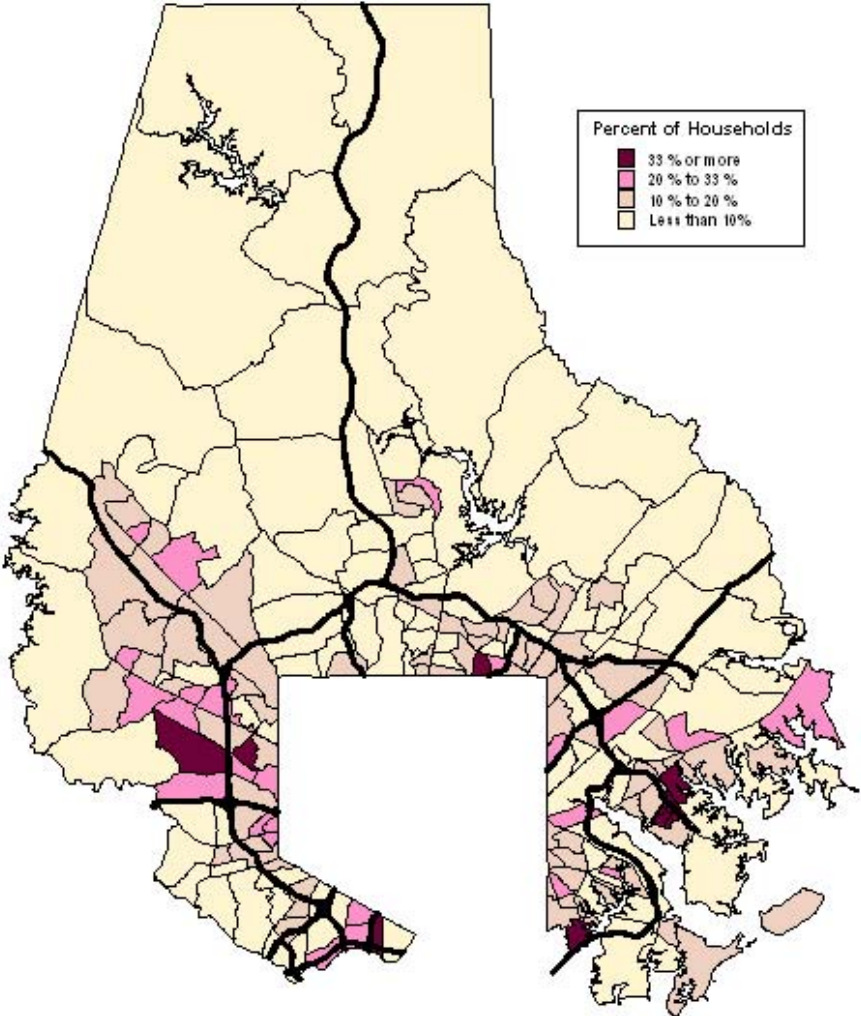

### 2000 Percent of Families in Poverty by Census Tract, Baltimore County



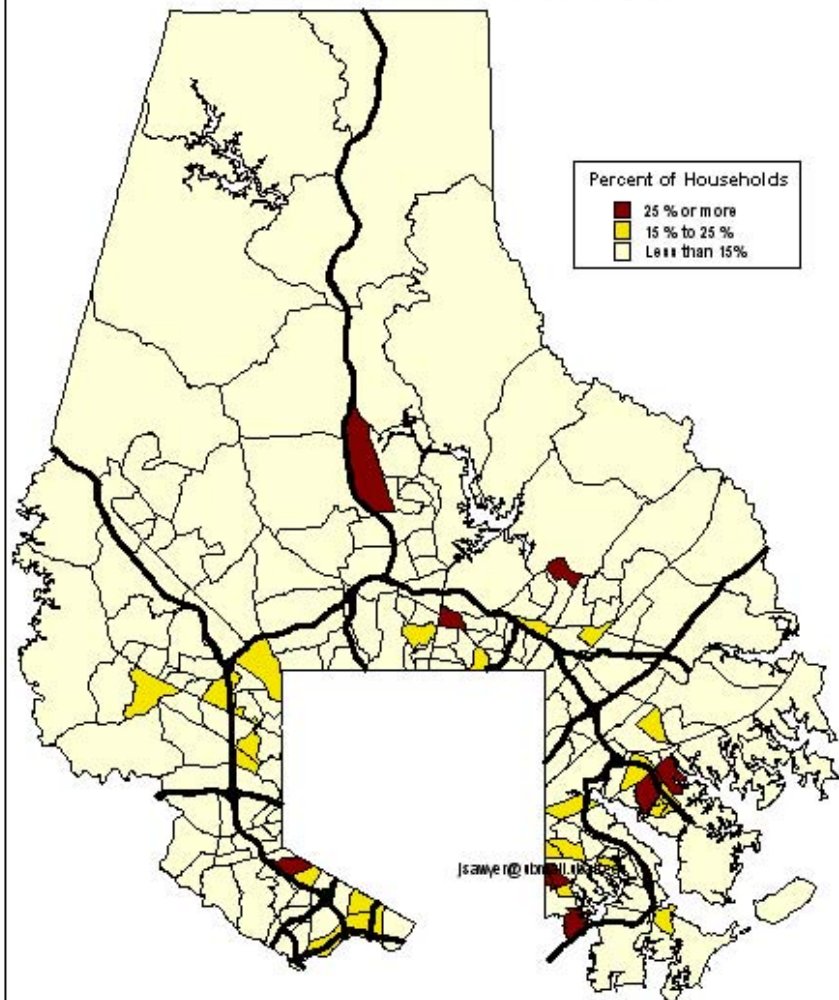

### 2000 Percent of Single Parent Households with Children By Census Tract, Baltimore County



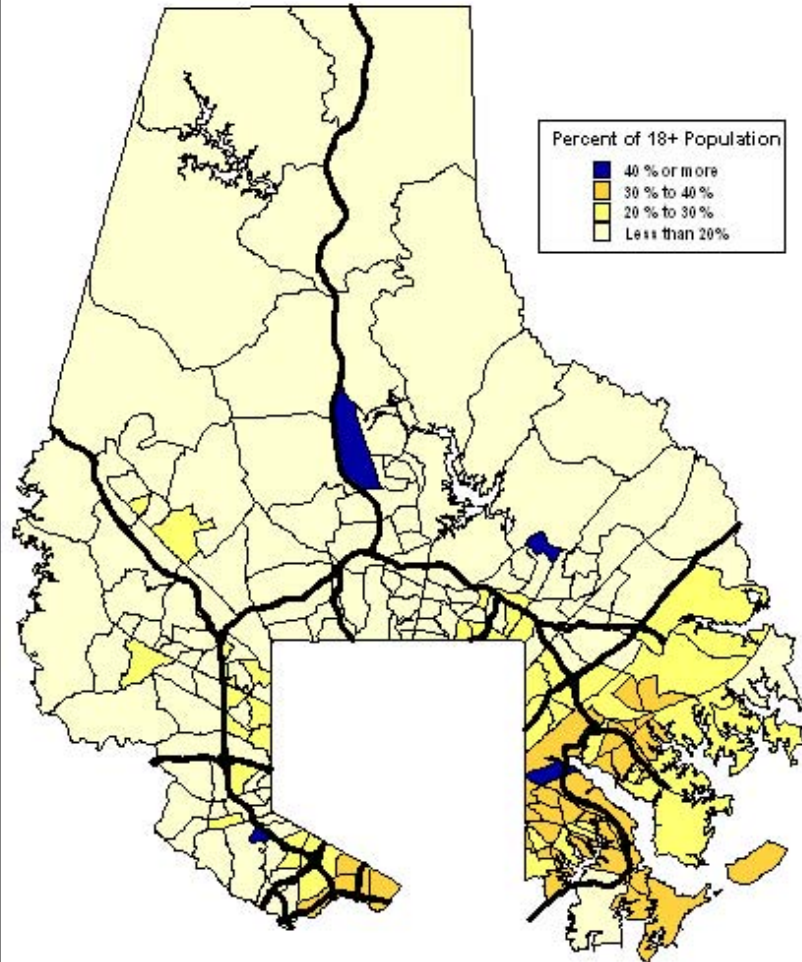

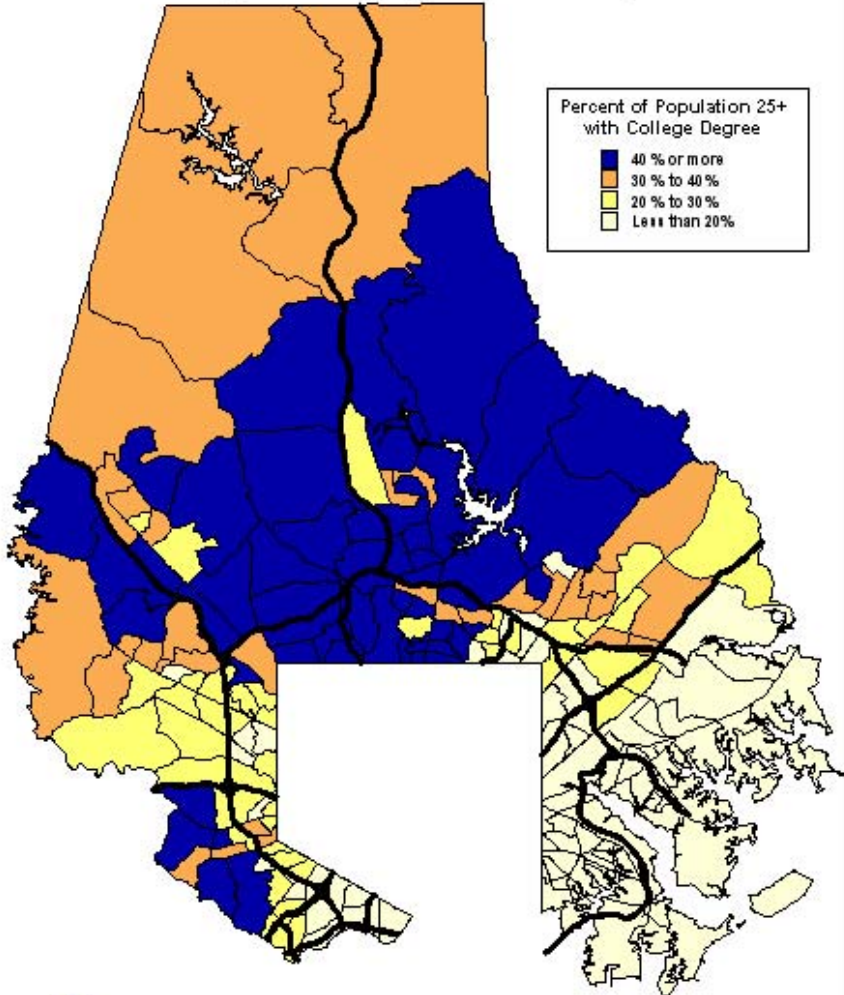
### 2000 Percent of 18+ Population Without H.S. Diploma by Census Tract, Baltimore County

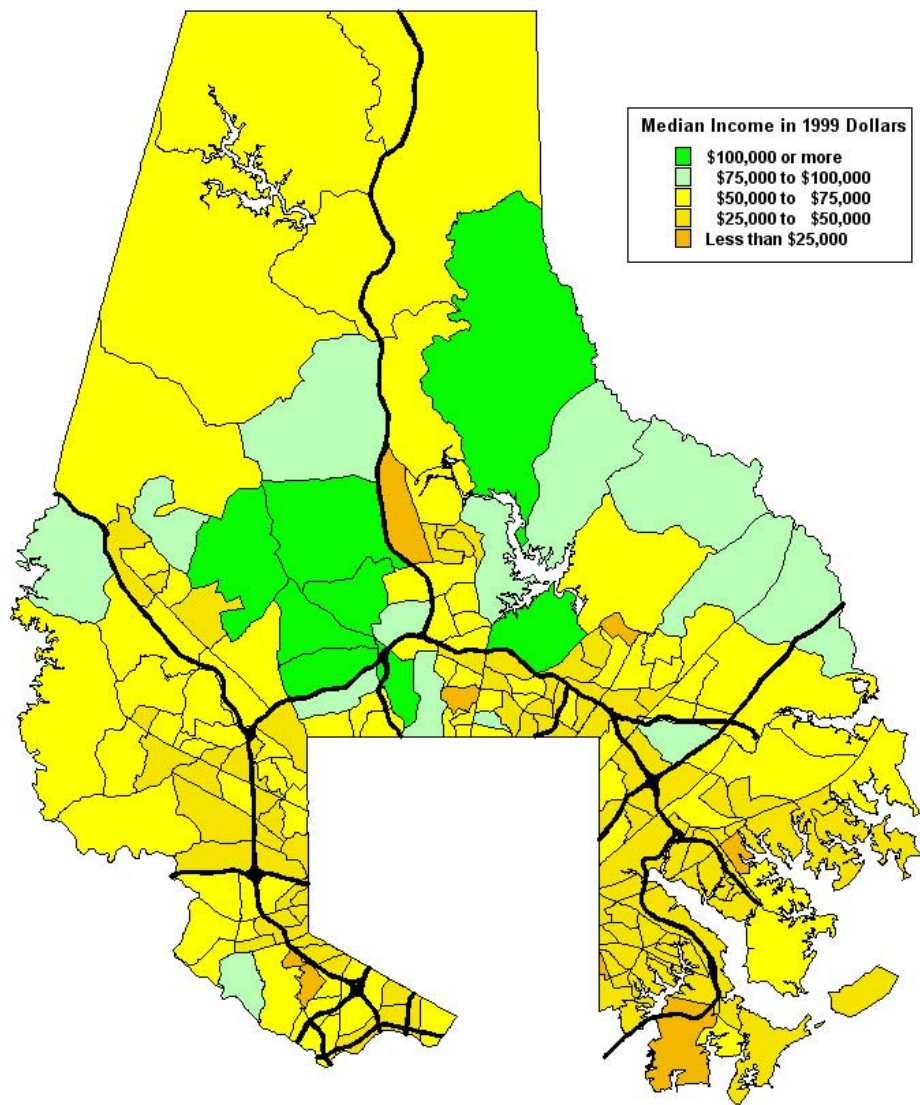
**2000 Percent of Population 25+ Years Old

## 2000 Median Household Income in Baltimore County by Census Tract

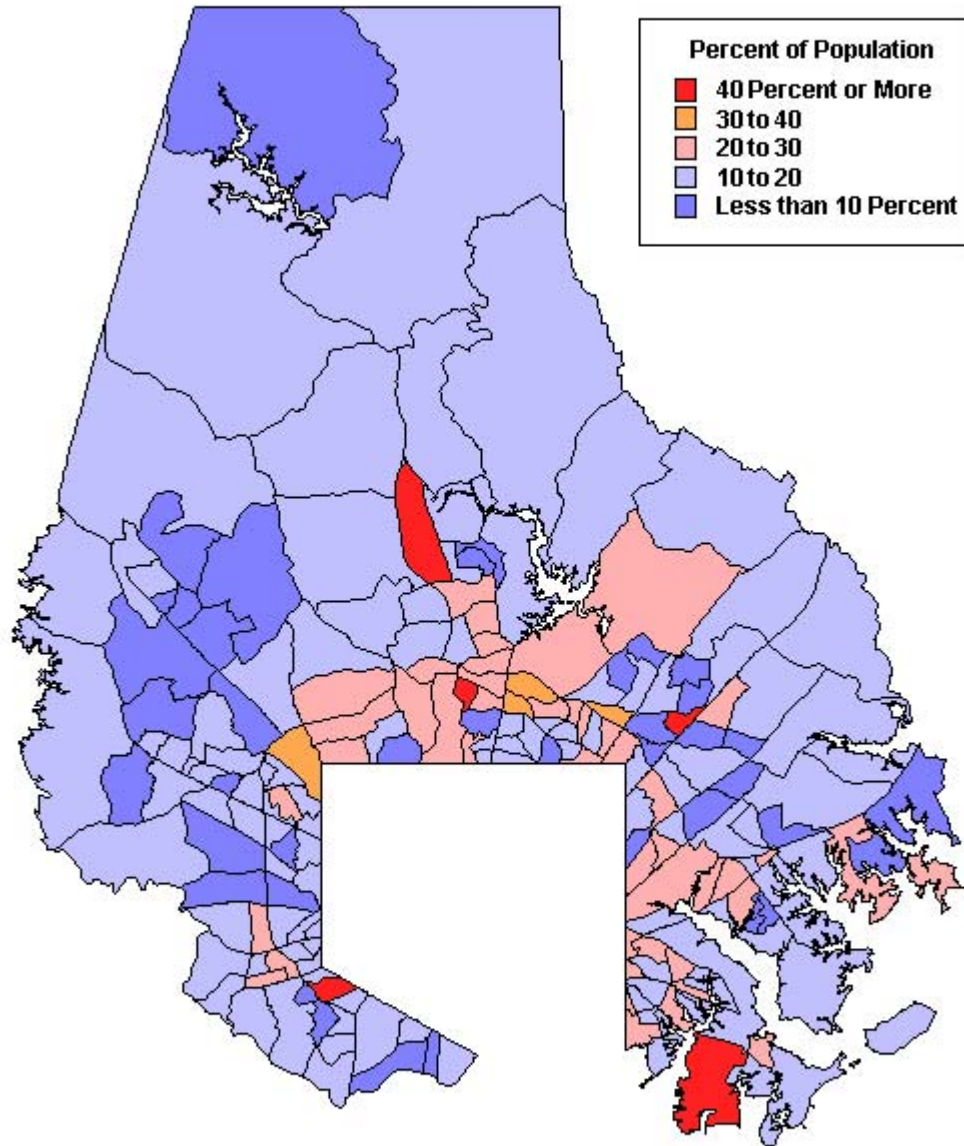


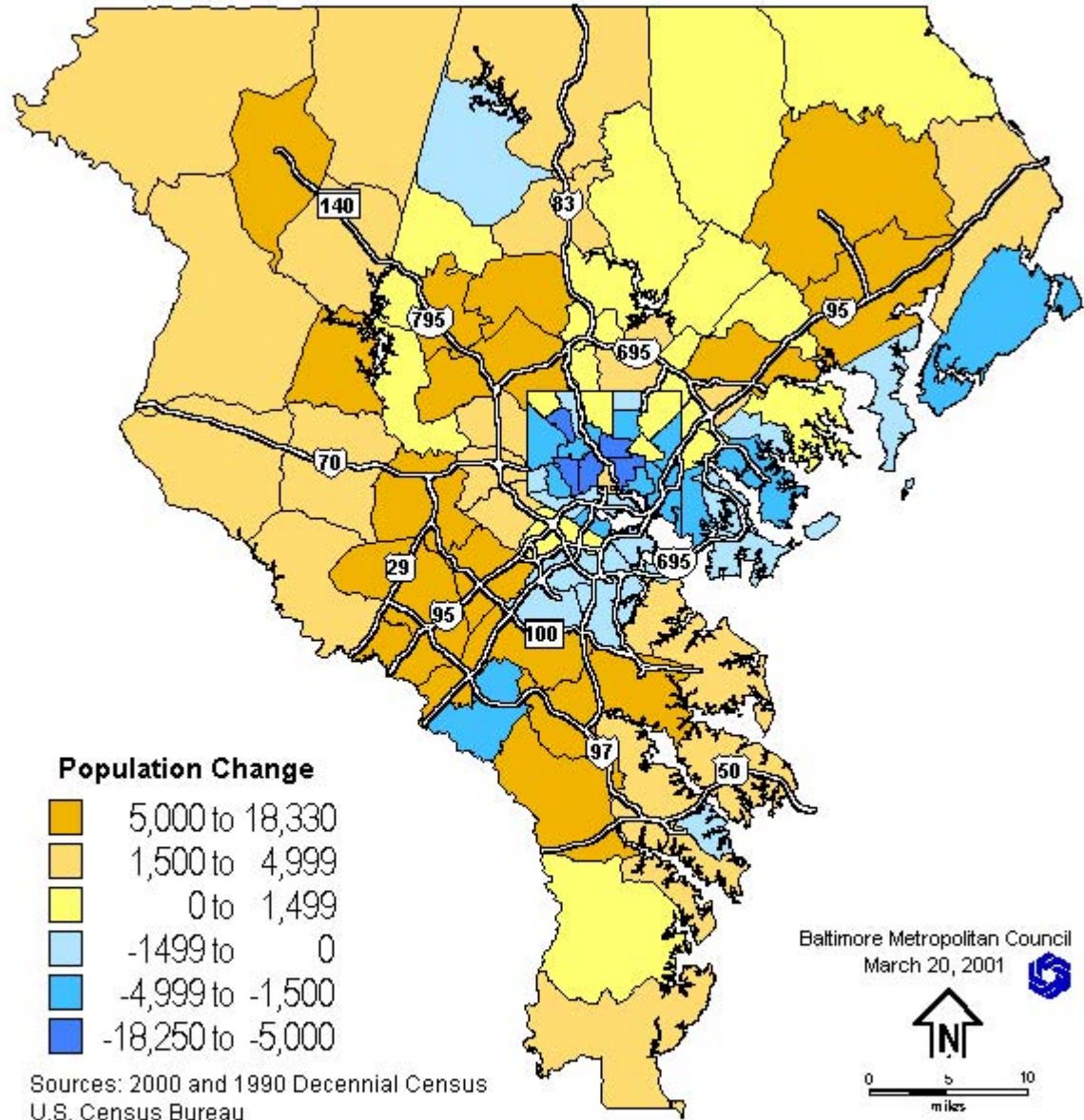

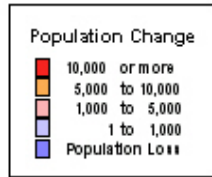
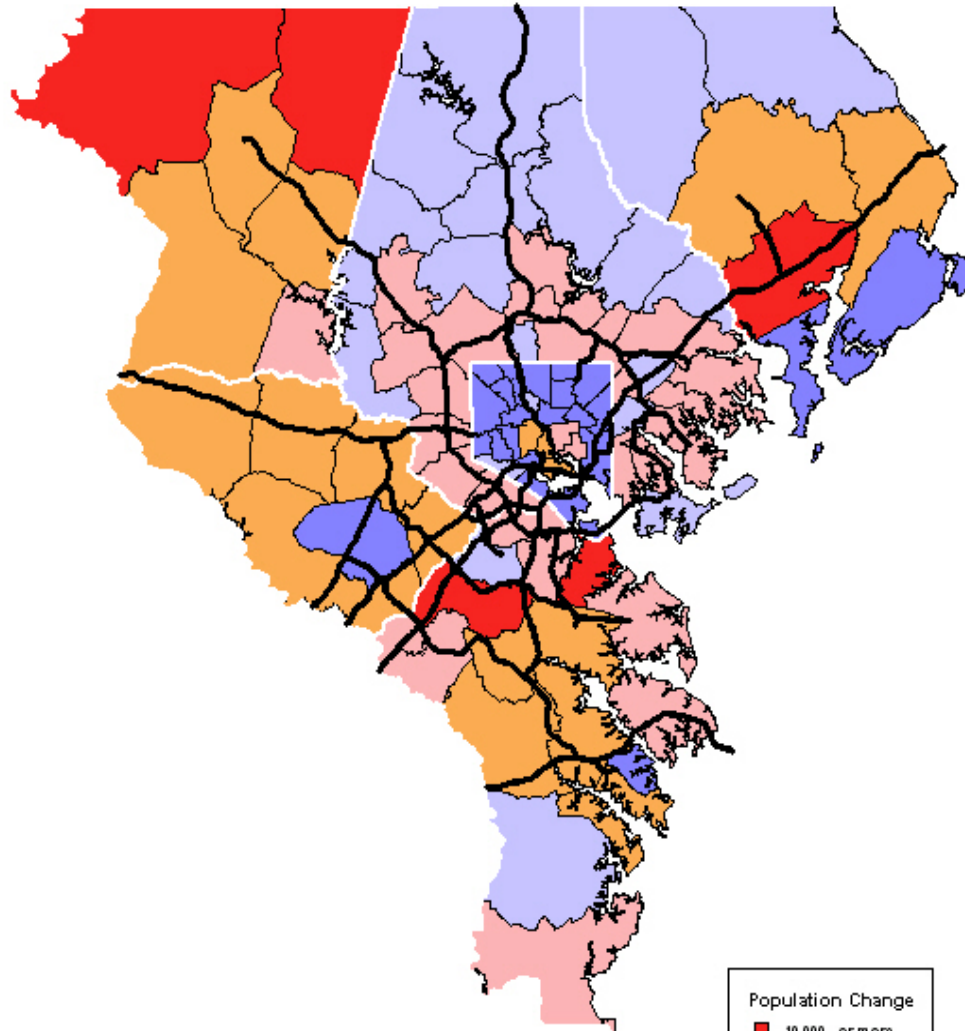

IN BALTIMORE COUNTY BY CENSUS TRACT**

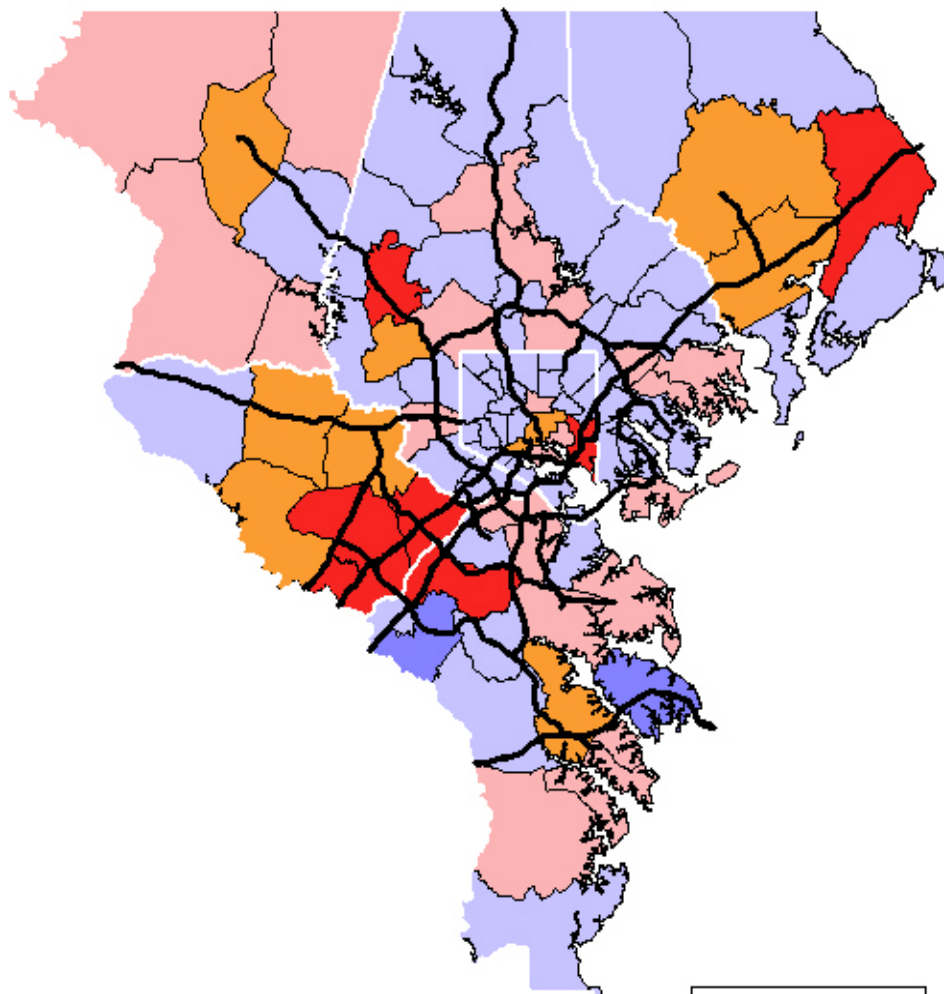




### Round 5-D Population Change, 2000 to 2025 in the Baltimore Region by Regional Planning Districts
