

# Open for Public Review: Amendment to FY 2010-2013 Transportation Improvement Program

The MD Department of Transportation (MDOT), on behalf of the MD Transit Administration, is requesting to amend the 2010-2013 Transportation Improvement Program to include \$9.4 million worth of station and track improvements at the BWI MARC station.

\$9.4 million of High Speed Intercity Passenger Rail funds has been received from the Federal Railroad Administration to perform Preliminary Engineering for a 4th track, new platform and station building at the BWI MARC station. The new station building will utilize Green design to accommodate growing BWI ridership and other development needs.

Funding will also be used for track and platform improvements. This includes nine miles of a new 4th track to build out the corridor and reduce congestion while improving safety. The new platform will accommodate the new track and allow for an island platform so that all tracks could be used for passenger services.

## Public Review and Comment

A public review period will be held from Friday, September 10 through Monday, October 11, 2010. A public meeting to answer questions and accept comments on this amendment will be held on Monday, September 27 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the MD Department of Transportation (7201 Corporate Center Drive P.O. Box 548, Hanover, Maryland 21076 ).
