

Transportation Improvement Program

Baltimore City has submitted two projects for amendments to the 2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program.

Kent Street Transit Plaza and Pedestrian Corridor Project

To expand bus ridership and safe access to the existing light rail, strengthen the economically distressed community around the Westport Waterfront Project. Funds will be used for the design and construction of the Kent St. Plaza & Pedestrian Corridor from the Westport Light Rail Station to Annapolis Rd. Project funding comes from the Urban Circulator/Bus and Bus Livability Program.

Transit Vehicle Purchases Project

To expand Baltimore City's bus fleet in order to extend service to Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine. Funds will be used to purchase hybrid-electric transit vehicles for use in the Charm City Circulator. Project funding for these transit vehicles comes from the Paul S. Sarbanes Transit in Parks Program.

A public review period will be held from Thursday, August 12, through Tuesday, September 14, 2010. A public meeting will be held on Tuesday, August 31, from 4 to 5:30 p.m. at the Baltimore Metropolitan Council (2700 Lighthouse Point East, Suite 310, Baltimore, MD 21224).
