



US 40 (Pulaski Highway) Revitalization: I-695 (Baltimore Beltway) to Ebenezer Road



The Maryland Department of Transportation on behalf of the MD State Highway Administration is requesting an amendment to the 2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program to add a new project.

Baltimore County is working with the State Highway Administration and the Maryland Department of Transportation to create a Master Plan for the US 40 (Pulaski Highway) corridor. At this time, \$163,000 is proposed to be directed to the Project Planning phase for the study area along US 40 (Pulaski Highway) bounded by MD 7 (Philadelphia Road) to the west, Bird River Road/Transvers Avenue to the east, Martin Boulevard to the south, and Reames Road to the north.

This study will engage key property owners, community stakeholders and government officials to develop a framework master plan for revitalization of this corridor. Through coordinated revitalization efforts, including mixed-use redevelopment in the proposed revitalization district, combined with the creation of a local street network, and changes to support multi-modal travel, implementation of these efforts would result in less future congestion at many intersections in the area. This project can also serve as a real-world test case for the US 40 Carbon Neutral Corridor Pilot Project.

A public review and comment period will be held from Friday, August 26 through Monday, September 26, 2011. All mailed comments must be received no later than 3 days after the close of the comment period.
