2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program & Air Quality Report

Approximately \$1.2 billion dollars worth of transportation projects and improvements are being proposed in this draft Transportation Improvement Program, released for review by the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board.

New projects added for FY 2011 include:

- One lane northbound on US 29 between Seneca Drive and MD 175
- MARC parking expansion at the Aberdeen station
- Reconstruction of the bridge on US 40 over the Patapsco River between Howard and Baltimore counties
- A streetscape project on North Ave between Aisquith and Wolfe Streets
- An extension of Danville Street from Clinton Haven Streets in a former CSX right-of-way to support freight movement near the Port

Examples of other proposed projects include: Dozens of local and state bridge rehabilitations; New/improved interchanges at I-795 and Dolfield and US 40 at MD 715; Replacement buses and repair of light-rail and Metro vehicles.

A report looking at the potential impact these transportation projects could have on the region's air quality is also being released for review. The report states that projects in this draft TIP do not worsen the region's air quality or delay timely attainment of the national ambient air quality standards.
