Mr. Eli Glazier will present on the Montgomery County Pedestrian Master Plan which is Montgomery Planning's first comprehensive vision to create safer, more comfortable experiences walking or rolling around the county, and to make getting around more convenient and accessible for every pedestrian. Approved in October 2023, the Plan provides detailed, actionable recommendations in line with national and international best practices to improve the pedestrian experience, from more and better places to cross the street to a data-driven, equity-focused approach for the county's future pedestrian/bicycle capital investments.

4. PRESENTATION: SAFE AND EQUITABLE ACCESS TO MONTGOMERY PARKS (15 MIN)

Mr. Kyle Lukacs, will present on the Safe and Equitable Access to Montgomery Parks project which was awarded a \$7.5 million implementation grant through the federal program Safe Streets for All. This project will improve the safety of trail crossings and implement educational safety programs for pedestrians and cyclists throughout Montgomery and Prince George's Counties. The project will implement effective behavioral safety countermeasures paired with proven engineering countermeasures at approximately three sites based on crash data and high-injury network locations.
