2. RECOMMENDED ACTION OF RESOLUTION #18-6

The TC will be asked for its recommendation on Resolution #18-6 to add Hawkins Point Road over CSX railroad tracks to the 2018-2021 TIP using \$17.6 million in federal NHPP funds along with \$4.4 million in matching funds for the construction phase. This project had previously been in the 2017-2020 TIP, but must now be added to the 2018-2021 TIP as a result of delays in the process to advertise the project. www.baltometro.org/BRTB/BRTBRes18-6.pdf

The TC will be asked for its recommendation on Resolution #18-7 to accept the findings of the *Patapsco Regional Greenway Concept Plan and Implementation Matrix*. This plan/matrix is the result of a UPWP task.
