### 2. UPDATE ON ROUND 9 FORECASTS

Mr. Shawn Kimberly will give a brief update on the status of population and employment forecasts from the Cooperative Forecast Group. These forecasts will be inputs to the travel demand model during the modeling of a preferred alternative for *Maximize2045*.

- **Highway Safety Performance Targets** Mr. Terry Freeland will present regional highway safety data and potential performance targets provided by SHA. Following BRTB approval, these targets will be part of the system performance plan in the next long-range plan.
- **Financial Forecast** Mr. Don Halligan will continue the discussion about the financial forecast. This will cover the extent to which local revenues might be included in the regional forecast.
- Project Evaluation Criteria Mr. Freeland will present project evaluation criteria from the current longrange plan. Members will review and discuss potential revisions to the current criteria and consider how MDOT's Chapter 30 scoring criteria might affect the regional scoring criteria for the next plan.
