What We Do - BRTB

- Two-year work program (UPWP)
- Short-term transportation program (TIP)
- Long-range transportation plan (*Maximize 2040*)
- Air quality assessments of all transportation projects



What is the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- Short-range (four-year) program of transportation improvements & priority projects
- Financially constrained
- Authorizes project sponsor to seek or use federal funds
- Generally updated annually
 - Current TIP is FY 2017-2020
- Amendments require 30-day public review
 - New projects, new funding, etc.



Air Quality Assessment

- The TIP goes through a process that compares estimated pollutants (emissions) from transportation projects to limits (budgets) set by the state.



This report, called a “conformity determination”, addresses the 8-hour ozone standard.

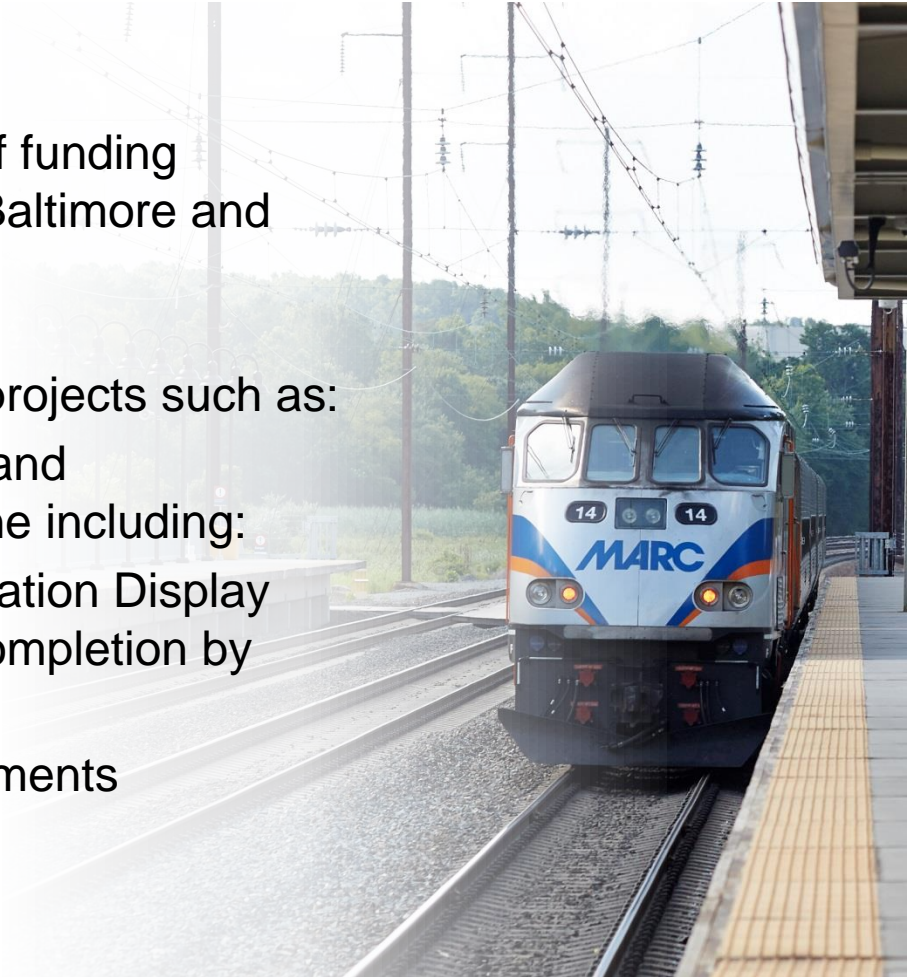
MARC Improvements

Proposed Amendment:

- Accounting-related re-allocation of funding requires an adjustment between Baltimore and Washington MPOs

This TIP sheet includes a variety of projects such as:

- Infrastructure rehabs, upgrades, and improvements along the Penn Line including:
 - BWI – New Passenger Information Display System Design - Estimated completion by 9/2018
 - B&P Tunnel Lighting Improvements



MARC Improvements *(cont.)*

- Infrastructure rehabs, upgrades, and improvements along the Camden and Brunswick Lines including:
 - Jessup Yard – Upgrades and Expansion
 - Switch Heater Replacement
- System-wide parking lot improvements including repaving, restriping, lighting, landscaping, and minor construction



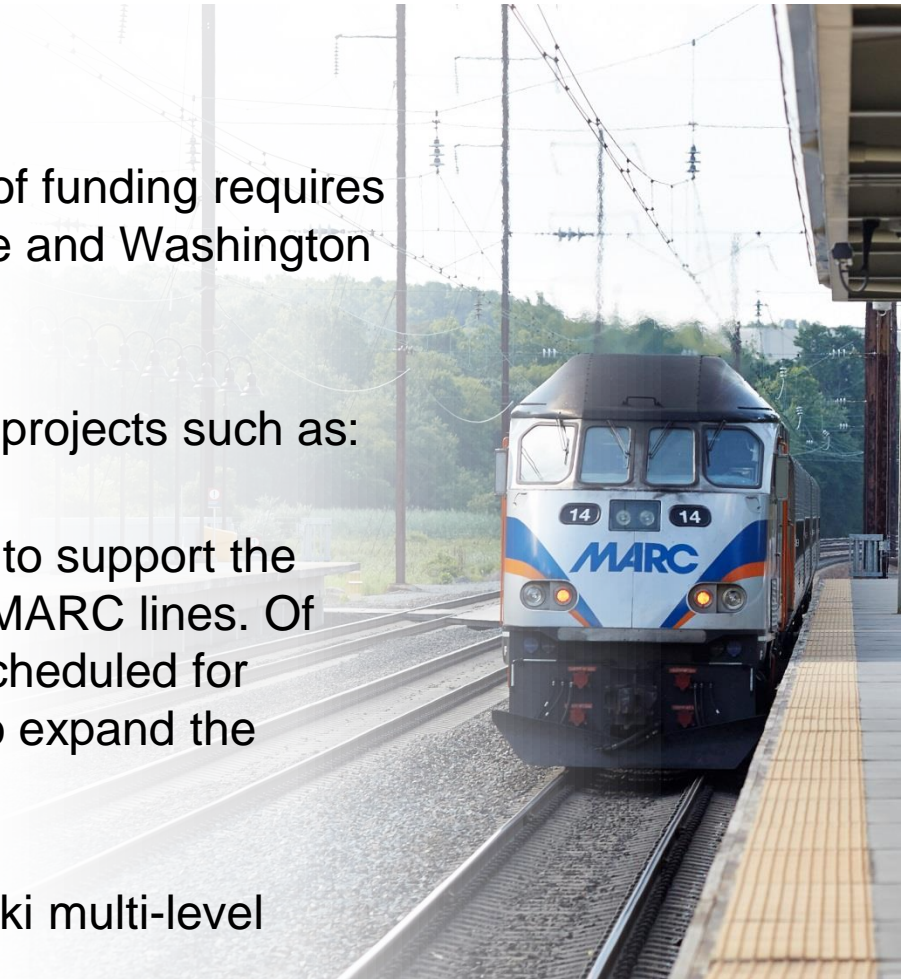
MARC Rolling Stock Overhauls and Replacement

Proposed Amendment:

- Accounting-related re-allocation of funding requires an adjustment between Baltimore and Washington MPO's

This TIP sheet includes a variety of projects such as:

- Purchase of 54 Bi-Level railcars to support the Penn, Camden, and Brunswick MARC lines. Of these, 38 will replace vehicles scheduled for retirement and 16 will be used to expand the MARC fleet
- Overhaul of MARC's 63 Kawasaki multi-level vehicles



MARC Rolling Stock Overhauls and Replacement *(cont.)*

- Support implementation and development of Positive Train Control (PTC) for MARC as mandated by the Code of Federal Regulations
- Procurement of 8 diesel locomotives to support operational needs and retirement of aging motive power
- Repower 6 MARC GP-39 Diesel Locomotives to reduce emissions, lower fuel costs, and extend locomotive useful life by 25-30 years
- Overhaul of 26 MARC IIA vehicles originally built in 1985 and remanufactured in 1995, encompassing safety, interior, and communication improvements



Bus and Rail System Preservation and Improvement

Proposed Amendments:

- Includes 5307 Flex Funds totaling \$20.8 million over the span of FY 2017, FY 2018, and FY 2019 for BaltimoreLink
- Increase in obligation to Section 5307 funding. Total Section 5307 Obligation: \$9.449 million (\$1.45 million increase)

This TIP sheet includes a variety of projects such as:

- Repair/replace roofs on MTA Metro, Light Rail, MARC and Bus facilities



Bus and Rail System Preservation and Improvement *(cont.)*

- Rehabilitation of MTA paved facilities such as: park-&-ride lots, concrete bus loops, maintenance shops and bus storage facilities
- On-going structural repairs for underground Metro stations (leaks, cracks, etc.)
- Cyclical comprehensive structural inspection of Metro and Light Rail bridge and subway structures



Bus and Rail System Preservation and Improvement *(cont.)*

- BaltimoreLink Bus Link Transit Hubs:

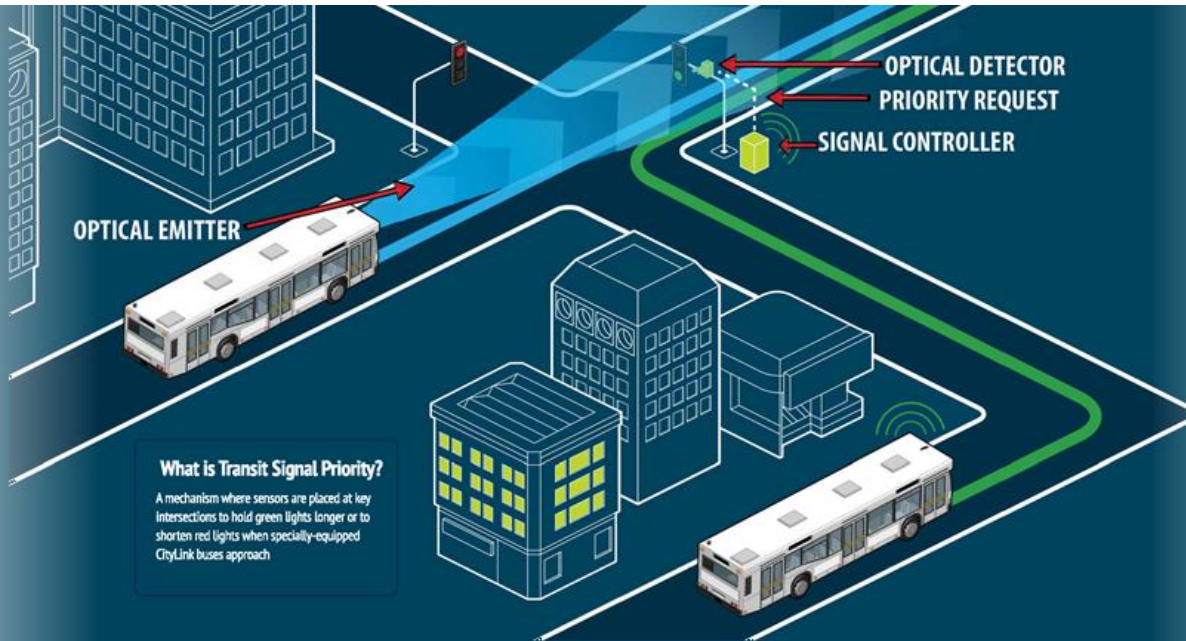
Through the BaltimoreLink project the entire core bus system will be redesigned. To make the new system more efficient, reliable, and user-friendly, the project team will develop, design, and construct hubs and transfer facilities. The facilities will allow for ease of movement throughout the system as patrons move between buses and/or modes.



Bus and Rail System Preservation and Improvement *(cont.)*

- BaltimoreLink Transit Signal Priority:

Design and implement a signal priority system to aid bus travel time along selected corridors.



Bus and Bus Facilities – Mini Overhaul

- Amendment to add new project:
Bus & Bus Facilities – Mini Overhaul
- Discretionary grant awarded to MTA
- The program will proactively repair and replace multiple bus components at key points in the vehicle's life
- Improves bus reliability
 - Increase vehicle lifespan
 - Improve maintenance efficiency
 - Reduce mechanical breakdowns
 - Mitigate safety risks
 - Develop workforce through training
- Cost savings
