



What We Do - BRTB

- Two-year work program (UPWP)
- Short-term transportation program (TIP)
- Long-range transportation
 plan (*Maximize 2040*)
- Air quality assessments of all transportation projects





What is the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- Short-range (four-year) program of transportation improvements & priority projects
- Financially constrained
- Authorizes project sponsor to seek or use federal funds
- Generally updated annually
 - Current TIP is FY 2017-2020
- Amendments require 30-day public review

New projects, new funding, etc.



Air Quality Assessment

 The TIP goes through a process that compares estimated pollutants (emissions) from transportation projects to limits (budgets) set by the state.



This report, called a "conformity determination", addresses the 8-hour ozone standard.





AMENDMENT PURPOSE

- Cost increased to over \$10 million, making it a major project, needing TIP listing and line item in MDOT CTP
- Core item cost increase and added scope





I-695 at Cromwell Bridge Rd Drainage Improvement PROJECT PURPOSE

- Prevent further erosion to I-695 embankment
- Mitigate for current and future MDOT SHA construction projects
- Upgrade County sewer line





PROJECT ELEMENTS

- Restoration of Minebank Run
- Stabilize and restore embankment on I-695
- Construction of submerged gravel wetland
- Relocate County sewer line


