\$1.1 Billion Project To Add Two Express Toll Lanes on Northbound I-95 from White Marsh to Abingdon


BALTIMORE, MD – The Hogan Administration announced today the investment of an additional \$890 million to extend the northbound I-95 Express Toll Lanes (ETL). The expanded \$1.1 billion project will now provide two ETLs for more than 10 miles from north of MD 43 in Baltimore County to north of MD 24 in Harford County. Governor Larry Hogan initially announced the ETL northbound extension project in December 2017 as part of his Baltimore Traffic Relief Plan.



Program Overview












Traffic Improvements

- Today, the I-95 section at Exit 77 (MD 24) ranks 27 out of the 30 worst bottlenecks in the major corridors of Maryland.
- PM Peak congestion regularly results in delays from Exit 77 (MD24) back to Exit 64 (I-695).
- Without improvements, the queues at the ETL merge point north of MD 43 will extend further and increase travel time for all motorists along I-95.
- With improvements, congestion relief will be provided along northbound I-95 for motorists using the MD 152 and MD 24 interchanges in the PM peak period.















Traffic Safety

 Four Candidate Safety Improvement Segment (CSIS) locations will be addressed by this project.











MD 152 Park and Ride Relocation

- Current facility is operating at or near capacity, and will be impacted by widening for ETLs on northbound I-95.
- Over 80% of users originate from the north on MD 152 and I-95.
- Sites for relocation to the north on MD 152 are under consideration and are being coordinated with property owners.
