Why Self Certification?

- The Metropolitan Planning Rule directs all Transportation Management Areas (i.e., urbanized areas with a population of 200,000 or more) to certify that the metropolitan transportation planning process is being carried out by the State and the MPO in accordance with all applicable requirements
- Concurrent with the submittal of any proposed Transportation Improvement Program to the FHWA and the FTA





What Are These Applicable Requirements?

- 1. Metropolitan Planning Regulations
- 2. Clean Air Act (Conformity Determination)
- **3**. Nondiscrimination General
- Nondiscrimination Civil Rights (Civil Rights Act of 1964)
- 5. Nondiscrimination ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990)

- 7. Nondiscrimination Gender
- Nondiscrimination Disabilities (Rehabilitation Act of 1973)

- References additional progress to date on Resilience 2050, including:
 - Final set of 11 White Papers
 - Development of advertising plan to support public involvement
- Approved the Financial Forecast
- Completed first assessment of Local Financial Forecasting
- Updated Public Participation Plan
- Updated Limited English Proficiency Plan
