

 - Harford Transit (Transit Representative)










MPO Planning Process

- Federal Funding = MPO consultation

What We Do: Plans & Programs

- Long-Range Transportation
 Plan
 - Every 4 years
 - Current: Maximize 2040 (2020-2040)





- Short-term Transportation
 Improvement Program (TIP)
 - Developed 1x/year or every other year
 - Current: 2017-2020 TIP
 - Amendments (as needed)





What We Do: Plans & Programs

Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

 Annual budget and plan of work by BMC staff and local jurisdictions



Developed every 2 years



Conformity Determination

- Evaluation of impact of planned and programmed projects on region's air quality
- Developed each year with TIP, every 4 years with long-range plan

- PAC may review and make recommendations for changes each year
- Updated in 2014




Public Advisory Committee

On Tuesday, September 23, 2014 the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board voted to approve a change to their bylaws that changes the name of this committee from Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) to the Public Advisory Committee (PAC). This change was made in an effort to promote inclusion and avoid confusion of the term "citizens" with U.S. citizenship, as U.S. citizenship is not a requirement of participation in the BRTB committees or the metropolitan planning process.
