# What is the TIP?


- Projects programmed for funding in any of the next four fiscal years
  - Federally funded projects
  - Regionally significant, non-federally funded projects
- Types of Projects: highway, transit, bicycle, pedestrian, management & operations
- Translates recommendations from the long-range plan, *Maximize2040,* into a short-term program of improvements
  - Capacity improvements identified individually
  - System preservation and system operations projects
  - All TIP projects reviewed for consistency with *Maximize2040*, including year of operation and design concept and scope










# Comparison of Total Funds Programmed in the 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 TIPs








## Distribution of 2019-2022 TIP Funding by Fiscal Year




#### Percentage of Total Funding by Project Category








### Distribution of FY 2019 Funding by Project Phase


