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Cooperative Rider Clause

The Mid-Atlantic Purchasing Team (MAPT) is the agreement between the Baltimore Metropolitan Council ("BMC") and the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments ("MWCOG") to aggregate the public entity and non-profit purchasing volumes in the Maryland, Virginia and Washington, D.C. region ("region").

Format

A lead agency format is used to accomplish this work. The lead agency has included this MAPT Cooperative Rider Clause in this solicitation indicating its willingness to allow other public entities to participate pursuant to the following Terms and Conditions:

1. Terms

- a. Participating entities, through their use of the Cooperative Rider Clause, agree to the terms and conditions of the resulting contract to the extent that they can be reasonably applied to the participating entity.
- b. Participating entities may also negotiate additional terms and conditions specific to their local requirements upon mutual agreement between the parties.
- Other Conditions Contract and Reporting
 The supplier/contractor and participating entity agree:
 - a. The contract resulting from this solicitation shall be governed by and "construed in accordance with the laws of the State/jurisdiction in which the participating entity officially is located;
 - To provide to BMC and/or MWCOG contract usage reporting information, including but not limited to quantity, unit pricing and total volume of sales by entity, as well reporting other participating entities added on the contract, on demand and without further approval of contract participants;
 - c. Contract obligations rest solely with the participating entities only;
 - d. Significant changes in total contract value may result in further negotiations of contract pricing with the lead agency and participating entities.

In pricing and other conditions, vendors are urged to consider the broad reach and appeal of MAPT with public and non-profit entities in this region.

Extension to Other Jurisdictions

The [issuing jurisdiction] extends the resultant contract (s), including pricing, terms and conditions to the members of the Mid-Atlantic Purchasing Team, as well as all other public entities under the jurisdiction of the United States and its territories.

Inclusion of Governmental & Nonprofit Participants (Optional Clause)

This shall include but not be limited to private schools, Parochial schools, non-public schools such as charter schools, special districts, intermediate units, non-profit agencies providing services on behalf of government, and/or state, community and/or private colleges/universities that required these good, commodities and/or services.

Notification and Reporting

The Contractor agrees to notify the issuing jurisdiction of those entities that wish to use any contract resulting from this solicitation and will also provide usage information, which may be requested. The Contractor will provide the copy of the solicitation and resultant contract documents to any requesting jurisdiction or entity.

Contract Agreement

Any jurisdiction or entity using the resultant contract (s) may enter into its own contract with the successful Contractor (s). There shall be no obligation on the party of any participating jurisdiction to use the resultant contract (s). Contracts entered into with a participating jurisdiction may contain general terms and conditions unique to that jurisdiction Including, by way of illustration and not limitation, clauses covering minority participation, non-discrimination, indemnification, naming the jurisdiction as an additional insured under any required Comprehensive General Liability policies, and venue.

BULK CHEMICALS FOR WATER AND WASTEWATER TREATMENT

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. <u>SCOPE</u>:

- A. This bid is for the supply and delivery of chemicals for water and wastewater treatment to the Mid Atlantic Purchasing Team, MAPT. The participating members are: Harford County, Maryland, Carroll County, Maryland, the City of Aberdeen Maryland, the City of Havre de Grace, Maryland, Howard County, Maryland and Town of Manchester, Maryland on an as-required basis during the term of the contract. The chemicals and quantities are listed on each agency Bid Forms.
- B. This RFB will be conducted as a Multistep Competitive Sealed Bid also referred to as a REVERSE AUCTION. The Buyer has partnered with eBridge to host this bidding event on its Web-Based Bidding Platform.

<u>Phase 1</u>: BIDDERS SHALL SUBMIT UNPRICED OFFERS per instruction within this RFB.

Phase 2: PRICES ONLY WILL BE ACCEPTED IN THE SECOND PHASE DURING THE ONLINE REVERSE AUCTION BIDDING EVENT.

Prices will be accepted only from bidders whose complete and accurate response to this RFB is found acceptable during PHASE 1. Approved bidders will receive notice that they have been approved to participate in the reverse auction. Those bidders will complete a detailed reverse auction system training session with eBridge.

C. Review Section VIII, which contains the attached eBridge Information. The awarded bidders are obligated to pay a transaction fee to eBridge pursuant to the Terms and Conditions contained in Section VIII, which are accepted upon placement of the initial bid.

2. <u>TYPE OF CONTRACT</u>:

A. This is a requirements-type contract under which participating agencies are obligated during the term of the contract to purchase its normal requirements of chemicals listed on the Bid Form, and the Contractor is obligated to supply quantities of said chemicals that each agency requires in its operations.

B. If the contractor fails to make delivery within the time stipulated or otherwise fails to honor the contract, the awarding agencies reserves the right to purchase the required chemicals from other sources to meet emergency needs without prejudice of the contract. Any costs to the using agency is above the contract unit price shall be the responsibility of the contractor as stipulated in Item 5, SP-2, Section DELIVERY.

3. **QUANTITIES**:

- A. Quantities stated herein are given as a general guide for bidding and are not guaranteed amounts. Actual requirements may be more or less than the quantities indicated on the bid form.
- B. Additional quantities may be ordered during the term of the contract at the unit prices set forth in the contract. If, at the end of the term of the contract, the agency has not placed orders for the total estimated quantities set forth in the contract, the contract will nonetheless be terminated.
- C. Minimum orders for bulk liquid and dry chemical supplied by tankers are indicated in paragraph "REQUIREMENTS." The minimum order is the smallest order that will be placed for a chemical delivered by tanker.
- D. The typical order amount for containerized and bulk chemicals is also shown on the bid form. On occasion, the actual quantity per order may vary by ± 20 percent from the amount indicated. The unit price bid for chemicals and delivery shall be held constant for these normal fluctuations in purchase orders.

4. METHOD OF PURCHASE:

Upon execution of the contract, blanket purchase orders will be issued against which verbal or written orders will be placed for required chemicals.

5. DELIVERY:

- A. Delivery shall be made to each facility on an "as called for" basis. The agencies and their facilities and their addresses are shown on Appendix I, Pages 11-22.
- B. Chemicals are sometimes used at multiple locations within a given plant. Where a chemical is used at more than one location at a given facility, the delivery may be split between the two or more processing areas at the County's request without affecting the unit bid price.
- C. Deliveries are to be made within <u>four</u> calendar days upon either oral or

written instructions by an authorized representative of the agency referencing the blanket purchase order number. Failure by the contractor to make the delivery date requested by the agency representative will automatically give the agency the right to have the order filled by others and to charge the contractor the difference, above the contract price, if any, between the contract price and the price paid to have the order filled by others.

- D. Contractor shall provide a date and approximate delivery time for all scheduled deliveries. The contractor shall provide advanced notification to the requesting agency of delivery delays, and any changes such as new/different sources of supply, chemical concentration, NSF certification, etc.
- E. All delivery tickets shall include at a minimum the net weight, volume and the percent concentration of the product, and percent concentration of inerts, as applicable.
- F. Shipments of certain materials as noted in paragraph, REQUIREMENTS, shall include an affidavit of compliance/certification of analysis from the supplier certifying that the material meets the specified or referenced quality including, but not necessarily limited to, concentration, bulk density, specific gravity, impurities concentrations, and NSF certification.
- G. All containers shall be clearly marked to indicate the contents and shall bear the current proper precautionary information required by the stipulated referenced standard, USDOT, USEPA, Maryland Department of Environment and other regulatory agencies concerned with the hazardous nature of the chemical being shipped. All chemicals that are NSF approved shall be so marked on the label.
- H. Contractor is solely responsible for unloading all chemicals to the storage or usage locations at each plant. Contractor is also responsible for loading all empty and used chemical containers and pallets for return. Contractor is responsible for wearing appropriate PPE at all times and remaining present at the connection point to terminate unloading operations in the event of a spill or unauthorized release of the chemical. Contractor is solely responsible for the cleanup and disposal of spills in accordance with all current Local, State, and Federal regulatory requirements, laws, etc.
- I. The storage facilities at each of the agency facilities can be examined by the bidders on Monday through Friday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. All bidders are urged to do so in order to thoroughly familiarize themselves with loading and unloading facilities. Please contact the

J. Containerized chemicals will not be accepted if the vendor's delivery vehicle is not equipped with a properly functioning pallet jack and hydraulic lift/tail gate or if the agency determines or believes that the containers are unsafe.

6. CONTAINERS AND PALLETS:

- A. Bidders shall not be entitled to charge deposits on containers and pallets due to the accounting burden imposed on the County to track deposits and refunds. All containers and pallets shall be clearly marked with the name of the owners and an identifying serial number to uniquely distinguish the container or pallet.
- B. Empty containers and/or pallets shall be picked up by the contractor with each delivery of chemicals. All costs associated with the pickup, return, cleanup, and/or proper disposal of the containers shall be included in the

unit price bid.

C. All chemical containers, valves, and appurtenances shall be safe and in good working order. Valves for containerized gases shall be fully inspected by the contractor for operability, mechanical integrity and safety before the container is filled and delivered. If any agency determines that a valve, container or other appurtenant equipment is defective, unsafe or inoperable, the contractor shall replace the container at no cost to the agency within 24 hours of notification by the agency. Evidence of prior leakage, bent valve stems, hard to open valves, leaky packing, mismatched or unsecured valve covers, damaged piping threads, expired hydrostatic testing dates, etc. are examples of some of the problems that will result in rejection of containerized chemicals by the awarding agencies.

7. BID PRICES:

- A. DO NOT SUBMIT PRICING WITH YOUR PROPOSAL. Pricing only will be accepted during the reverse auction.
- B. Prices bid shall include all transportation and freight costs to the point of delivery at the applicable treatment or pumping facilities. The unit bid prices shall also include all appurtenant and incidental costs associated with the chemical including all costs associated with the pickup, return, cleaning and/or proper disposal of chemical containers, fuel, special insurance, etc.
- C. The contractor shall be solely responsible for payment of freight costs with the carrier. Collect shipments are not acceptable and will be rejected.

8. INFORMATION REQUIRED WITH BID SUBMITTAL:

- A. <u>All bids</u> shall include current Safety Data Sheets (SDS), manufacturer specifications, and certificates of analysis for each chemical bid. Failure to submit SDSs, specifications sheets, or certificates of analysis with the bid may disqualify the bid for that chemical.
- B. The apparent low bidders for each chemical may be asked to submit data on the chemical manufacturers Quality Assurance and Quality Control measures to ensure a consistent quality of chemical. Verification of NSF certification of the chemical may also be required. The data shall include statements regarding the sampling and analysis methods and statistical data (mean, standard deviation and population of the database thereof). This information if requested shall be furnished within seven calendar days of the date of request. Failure to provide the information within the stipulated time may result in the rejection of the bid.

- C. Vendor should submit one (1) original and five (5) copies of their Bid Forms.
- D. The terms "contractor", "supplier", "vendor", and "bidder" shall mean the company responding to this Request for Bids.
- E. Bidders shall complete the attached Mid-Atlantic Purchasing Team Rider and must return it along with their bid response.

9. <u>PAYMENT</u>:

- A. Payment to the contractor shall be made within 30 days of receipt of an invoice covering deliveries made during the month.
- B. Awarding agencies reserve the rights to hold payment or adjust payments for any products that do not meet the minimum specified or referenced standards. Where the concentration of the chemical product is beyond the stipulated range of concentrations, the agency may reject the shipment. Also, see paragraph DELIVERY for notification requirements for changes in sources and materials.
- C. Awarding agencies reserve the rights to withhold or adjust payments in the event that the contractor fails to deliver chemical within the stipulated time, unless otherwise agreed to by the agency in advance. The amount of the withholding will be based on the difference between the contract price and the price to have the order filled by others extended for the quantity ordered. If there is no difference in price, or if the price is less than the contract price, there will be no withholding of money.
- D. If an agency should choose to accept a shipment of chemicals in concentrations greater than the specified concentrations, the contractor shall <u>not</u> be entitled to additional compensation above the bid price unless agreed to in advance and in writing by the agency Director of Procurement and the Chief of Operations (or their duly authorized representatives).
- E. If an agency should choose to accept a shipment of chemicals in a concentration less than the specified concentration, the unit price for the chemical shall be prorated linearly down based on the active ingredient concentration. The Contractor must notify the agency in advance of any shipments of any concentrations that are outside the specified concentration(s).

10. INSURANCE:

10.1 The successful bidder shall, at all times during the term of each participating jurisdiction's contract, maintain and keep in force such insurance as

Workmen's Compensation, Liability, and Property Damage as will protect the successful bidder from claims under Workmen's Compensation Acts and also such insurance as will protect the successful bidder and the participating jurisdictions from any other claims for damages for person injury, including death, as well as from claims for damages to any property of each participating jurisdiction or of the public, which may arise from operations under this solicitation and each participating jurisdictions' contract, whether such operations are by the successful bidder or any subcontractor or any agent directly or indirectly employed by any of them.

10.2 During the progress of the work, the Contractor shall provide and maintain the insurance set forth below. The Contractor will furnish certificates evidencing that such insurance is in force and will make every reasonable effort to provide that ten (10) days prior notice be given to the County in the event of material change or cancellation.

The awarding agencies are to be additional insured in the Contractor's commercial general liability and umbrella excess insurance. The awarding agency is to be a named insured in the builder's risk policy.

- a) Contractor shall obtain the above-referenced insurance for the Agency, himself and his subcontractor in connection with their operations under this contract and at the job site until construction work is completed and accepted by the County.
- b) The Contractor shall comply with and qualify under current Workers' Compensation laws and at all times cause every subcontractor who shall be engaged in the work, to comply with and qualify under such laws.
- c) The Contractor shall save the agency harmless against loss or damage arising from the Contractor's failure to comply with and qualify under such laws.
- d) The Contractor agrees that if, by any reason of its failure, or failure of any such subcontractor to comply with and qualify under said laws the Agency shall be required at any time to pay any sum because any employee of Contractor or its subcontractor is or shall be considered as the employee of the Agency as provided in such Workers' Compensation laws, the Contractor shall repay to the agency such sums paid by the agency.
- e) Evidence satisfactory to the Agency that the Contractor and each of its subcontractors have qualified under the Workers' Compensation laws shall be submitted prior to the commencement of the work contemplated.
- f) Policies for commercial general liability insurance must be written to protect the Contractor against claims arising from operations of subcontractors.
- g) In all cases, Certificates of Insurance shall be forwarded to the Agency in duplicate The Agency shall be listed for notification in event of cancellation. Certificates must be filed before starting any work at the site.
- h) It is understood and agreed that the Contractor has bonded or will bond each of his employees engaged on the Project who have fiduciary responsibility. It is further agreed that the Contractor shall pay to the Agency any sum or sums

recovered from the Bonding Company arising out of acts of said employees involving funds of the Agency or property of the Agency. Any bonds required shall provide that coverage shall extend to and include the property of the Agency utilized in this project.

- i) Any and all return premiums and dividends for insurance directly charged to the Agency by the Contractor in connection with this Agreement shall belong to and be payable to the Agency.
- j) The contractor and his subcontractors shall maintain and make available for audit by the insurance company their representative payrolls and other records relating to the work reasonably necessary for the purpose of computing insurance premiums. The Contractor shall assure that such information and records shall also be made available by his subcontractors.
- k) The Contractor and subcontractor shall provide, at their own expense, automobile bodily injury and property damage liability insurance covering all automobiles whether owned, hired, or non-owned operated by or on behalf of the Contractor or subcontractors, with not less than the following limits:

- I) Prior to beginning work at the job site, the Contractor and subcontractor shall furnish to the Agency, Certificates of Insurance as evidence of the existence of such automobile liability insurance. Such certificates shall contain a ten (10) day prior written notice of cancellation or material change to the Agency.
- m) Contractors or subcontractors may at their own cost and expense obtain insurance additional to that required by the Agency under this Contract.
- n) The Contractor agrees to indemnify and save harmless the awarding Agency, from any and all losses, liabilities, damages, costs and expenses (including cost of defense, settlement, and reasonable attorney's fees), which the Agency may hereafter incur or be responsible for or pay for (to the extent that the same arises out of or are in connection with construction or operation of the Project) as a result of bodily injuries (including death) to any one person or damage (including loss of use) to any property caused by the sole negligence or wrongful acts of the Contractor (or any of his employees) or any person, firm or corporation (or any employees thereof) directly or indirectly employed or engaged by the Contractor.

11. TERM OF CONTRACT:

A. The term of the contract shall be from July 1, 2019 (or date of contract Execution, whichever is later) until June 30, 2020.

B. The term of the contract shall cover the period from the date of award through one year, with each agency having the exclusive option of extending the contract for four (4) additional one (1) year periods. The awarding agency reserves the right to terminate the Contract at any time.

12. ECONOMIC PRICE ADJUSTMENT:

1. All prices offered herein shall be fixed for one hundred eighty (180) days from effective date of this proposed contract. After this date, it shall be the vendor's responsibility to notify the awarding agency sixty (60) days in advance of any anticipated changes in prices. The vendor shall submit a written request for a price increase by furnishing bona-fide manufacturer's documents or price list reflecting the changes they have incurred. Increases shall be limited to the actual cost increase to the vendor during the contract term. Adjustments in price will be limited to one (1) adjustment per contract year. If the price increase is approved, the price will remain firm for the renewal term requested. Each awarding agency reserves the right to accept a request for a price adjustment, or the right to negotiate an adjustment in price or reject the request for a price increase within thirty (30) days after the written request is submitted.

All requests for price increase or decrease are subject to review and approval by the awarding agency. The maximum increase will have a ceiling of 10% annually and a net decrease of 10% annually.

The awarding agency will notify the vendor in writing of the effective date of any price adjustment it has approved.

- 2. **Price Decreases:** In the event of any decrease in price either by the manufacturer or if the Contractor shall charge a lower price to other customers, the agency shall be notified promptly and receive such decrease.
- 3. **Methanol:** All prices offered herein shall be fixed for one hundred eighty (180) days from effective date of the awarded contract. After this date, it shall be the vendor's responsibility to notify the awarding agency sixty (60) days in advance of any requested adjustment of price.

Methanol price adjustments shall be based on the regional contract prices for North America, Europe and Asia, Methanex Non Discounted Reference Price for the period of April1-31, 2019, plus the markup of the Contractor. The Methanex Index available at:

If a Methanol price increase request is approved, the price increase will be effective upon written approval from the awarding agency and will remain firm through the renewal period. Additional request for a price adjustment during the current contract term shall be determined at the agencies sole discretion. The awarding agency will notify the vendor in writing of the effective date of any price adjustment it has approved.

13. BID AWARD:

It is the intent of each agency included in this bid to award contract(s) on the basis of the lowest bid prices received for each of their bid items.

14. PREQUALIFICATION:

Prequalification is a requirement of this Bid. Contractor/Bidder must be prequalified for Polymers as a requirement of this Bid. See "Specific Agency Requirements" found on Page SP-9

15. REQUIREMENTS:

General:

- 1. The requirements for bulk chemicals are summarized on the attached Summary Table. Where a referenced standard is listed, it shall mean the latest issue including all addenda as of the date of this advertisement.
- 2. Any chemical used in the processing of potable water must be listed in the NSF Listing for Drinking Water Additives, latest edition
- 3. As of the date of this advertisement. Chemicals requiring NSF Listing are shown on the Summary Table.
- 4. Changes in sources of supply for any chemical are subject to approval by each agency. Contractors must provide at least 30 days advanced notification and complete documentation of any proposed changes in the source/manufacturer of chemicals.
- 5. The quantities shown in the bid documents as "wet weight" are the solution weights of the chemicals. When bidding, the bidder shall consider the "wet weight" or actual delivery weight, including transportation/ freight costs.
- 6. There is no requirement for a bid bond or performance bond for this bid.

- Hosting telephone tutorials with all suppliers on utilization of the electronic bid process
- Participating in any pre-bid conference(s)
- Hosting the auction event and providing support during the event
- · Publishing appropriate results to the users as well as obtaining feedback from participants
- 3. Conduit Services Only. The Solution provides an Internet conduit through which you may communicate the availability of your goods and services to potential buyers, potential buyers may communicate their procurement needs to you and you may respond to requests for quotations, bids or proposals in online bidding events. You will be entitled only to respond to requests of potential buyers for quotations, bids or proposals if you have accepted the terms and conditions of this Agreement. eBridge makes no representation or warranty of any kind concerning the reputation, reliability or any other matter concerning participating buyers. You must conduct your own inquiries concerning the qualifications and reputation of buyers, and must look only to the buyers with whom you choose to transact business for performance of any agreements with them.
- 4. Buyer Representations and Warranties. eBridge does not verify or validate the information provided by or any representations or warranties made by buyers on the Solution, and makes no representation or warranty of any kind to you concerning any buyer using the Solution. You shall look solely to the buyer with respect to any buyer-related information or representations and warranties and shall indemnify and hold eBridge harmless from and against any contract, damages or liability that may result from any buyer-related information or representations and warranties.
- 5. Coded Access. The Solution is available only to persons and entities who have read and agreed to the terms of this Agreement and who have been assigned access code(s) and/or password(s). You agree not to divulge your access codes or passwords to any other person or entity. If you allow either your access code or password to fall into the hands of an unauthorized person, eBridge has no way of detecting unauthorized use of such codes or passwords and is not responsible for such unauthorized use of the Solution. YOU MUST SAFEGUARD THE PASSWORDS AND ACCESS CODES. Unauthorized users of the Solution may be subject to both civil and criminal prosecution under state and federal law.
- 6. Availability and Operation of the Solution. While every effort will be made to keep the Solution operating during all scheduled hours of operation, no guarantee of uninterrupted operation can be given. You agree the services provided on the Solution are provided as is and neither you nor your business or agency will have any claim against eBridge as a result of any non-availability of the Solution at a particular time(s) or any failure of the Solution to operate as intended.
- 7. Sole Remedy. If you are dissatisfied with the functionality of the Solution or the services eBridge provides, your sole remedy is to cease using the Solution and/or services. YOU AGREE YOU HAVE, AND WILL HAVE, NO CLAIM OR RIGHT OF ACTION OF ANY KIND AGAINST eBridge RELATED TO YOUR USE OF THE SOLUTION. Without limitation of the foregoing, you waive any right you may have to claim or recover any special, incidental,

exemplary, punitive, consequential or other damages (including but not limited to lost profits and business interruption).

- 8. Virus. eBridge shall not be liable for any harm that may be caused by the inadvertent transmission of any computer virus, worm, time bomb, logic bomb, or such other computer program transmitted through the Solution.
- 9. Information You Provide. You agree and warrant that any information you provide about yourself or your organization or your agents when registering to use the Solution or subsequent to registration, is accurate, current and complete and you will maintain and update that information to ensure that is remains true, accurate and complete. If eBridge suffers any claim or incurs any liability as a result of information entered into the Solution by users of your account, you and your agency or business will indemnify eBridge against such claim or liability including costs and attorney fees incurred in defending against it.
- 10. Security. eBridge uses industry-standard security measures to safeguard any information you may provide to us on our website. You, your organization and/or your agents are responsible for managing your internal security by safeguarding password(s) and establishing your own internal security procedures, as you would for paper-based procurements, to assure the proper use of the Solution. In the event of any compromise in the security of the Solution, you shall immediately report the same to eBridge and a new password will be assigned for your use. However, perfect security does not exist on the Internet, and eBridge does not and cannot guarantee that information will remain secure.
- 11. Fees. The design, maintenance and operation of the Solution require substantial costs and investment incurred by eBridge. Thus, a transaction fee based on the total final purchase price stated upon award will be charged to the awarded supplier. Said fee will be assessed to the awarded supplier at the rate stated in the Electronic Bid Event Submission Form. All fees are to be paid to eBridge by the awarded supplier in the following manner:
 - Definitive Bids: Payment is made once delivery is made to the buyer and awarded supplier is paid by the buyer

 actual purchases made during the month. This agreement is binding on all renewable and/or evergreen/rollover contracts until and unless such time buyer re-bids same in a manner consistent with acceptable
 procurement procedures

Suppliers will ensure this transaction fee is included in every bid they submit before or during an auction. You further acknowledge any payment made by a buyer with respect to a sale in which you were the winning bidder, whether or not such payment is made directly to you or a third party, will cause you to be immediately liable to eBridge for the transaction fee. Because these fees are expected to be INCLUDED in your pricing, they shall not be delineated in your invoicing to the buyer.

When any government agency or other entity purchases bulk chemicals for water and wastewater treatment from the resultant Contractor(s) based upon the results of the reverse auction from this RFB, Contractor(s) is obligated to pay the two percent (2.0%) fee to eBridge and report monthly usage to eBridge for each chemical purchase. This is regardless of whether the government agency or other entity that buys bulk chemicals for water and wastewater treatment is one of the initial participating jurisdictions and regardless of whether such agency or entity appears on the Mid-Atlantic Purchasing Team Rider Clause.

Any and all subsequent or additional orders, including but not limited to, any additional jurisdictions/entities that ride/bridge or buy from the contract and/or pricing that result from this specific electronic bid for bulk chemicals for water and wastewater treatment is subject to these terms and conditions in their entirety.

Any and all subsequent orders resulting from this specific electronic bid for like equipment, services or materials are subject to these terms and conditions.

12. Disclosures. You acknowledge by using the Solution, you agree to provide to eBridge accurate and complete information regarding: (a) any agreement entered into by you with a participating buyer through any online bidding

event conducted through the Solution, (b) the final price agreed upon between you and the participating buyer with respect to any product or service sold to such buyer, and (c) the date payment (whether a payment in full or a partial or installment payment) is delivered to you by any buyer pursuant to any agreement entered into by you with a participating buyer through any online bidding event conducted on the Solution or through the Solution. You are to provide this information to eBridge immediately upon becoming aware of such information. eBridge relies upon your delivery of such information for the calculation and payment of its fees as set forth in Section 11.

13. Privacy Policy. eBridge shall have the right to monitor the Solution electronically from time to time and to disclose any information as necessary to satisfy any law, regulation or other government request, to operate its service properly, or to protect itself or its users. eBridge reserves the right to refuse to post or to remove any information or materials, in whole or in part, that, in eBridge's sole discretion, are unacceptable or in violation of this Agreement.

The information eBridge receives is determined by your activities when using the Solution. If you use the Solution to read or download information, eBridge collects and stores the following information about you: the name of the domain and host through which you access the Internet and the date and time you access the Solution. eBridge uses this information to measure the number of visitors to different sections of the Solution, so that eBridge can make the Solution more useful to visitors. If the Solution is used by another person using your access code or password, you will be responsible for and shall indemnify and hold eBridge harmless from and against any contract, damages or liability that may result from the use of your access code or password.
- **15. Access to Internet.** You agree that in order to use the Solution you must: (a) provide and pay for your own access to the Internet, and (b) provide and pay for all equipment necessary for you to make the connection to the Internet.

You may download, use, and copy the materials found on the Solution for your internal business use only, provided that all copies of the Content must bear any copyright, trademark, or other proprietary notice located on the Solution which pertains to the material being copied. The Content may not be republished or reprinted in whole or in part. Except as authorized in this paragraph, you are not granted a license under any copyright, trademark, patent, or other intellectual property right in the material or the services, processes, or technology described therein. All such rights are retained by eBridge and/or any third party owner of such rights. You may not sell or modify the Content or reproduce, display, publicly perform, distribute, or otherwise use the Content in any way for any public or commercial purpose. The use of the Content on any other website or in a networked computer environment for any purpose is prohibited. None of the Content, including any software, may be reverse engineered, disassembled, decompiled, reproduced, transcribed, stored in a retrieval system, translated into any language or computer language, retransmitted in any form or by any means, resold, or redistributed without the prior written consent of

- eBridge, except as described herein. Nothing in this paragraph prohibits you from printing, using or reproducing any records or reports of transactions using the Solution.
- 19. Framed Links. You may not create framed links to the Solution without the prior written consent of eBridge.
- 20. Modification. eBridge, in its sole discretion, has the right to modify this Agreement at any time. However, any such modification shall not affect the terms of any online bidding events already completed or in process. Any modification is effective upon either posting notice of such modification on eBridge's website or upon notice by mail. Your continued use of the Solution following notice of any modification to this Agreement shall be conclusively deemed an acceptance of all such modifications.
- 21. Non-Circumvention. You agree you will not, directly or indirectly, take any action which circumvents or attempts to circumvent the intent or purpose of this Agreement. Further, you agree that once you electronically viewed or received a specific request for quotations from a buyer, you will not, directly or indirectly, enter into any agreement related to your quotations for this specific event with such buyer outside the Solution to include paper bids or verbal negotiation which would result in your failure to pay to eBridge the fee(s) set out in Section 11 hereof. You agree to maintain confidentiality between the buyer, you, your representatives, your company and its agents and suppliers and eBridge regarding the submission of quotations and subsequent pricing before and during the auction event.
- 22. Governing Law. This Agreement and the rights of the parties to this Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the state in which the Buyer resides, without regard to or application of its conflict of laws principles.
- 23. Partial Enforceability. If any provision of this Agreement, or the application of any provision to any person, entity or circumstance shall be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable, then the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of that provision to persons, entities or circumstances other than those with respect to which it is held invalid, illegal or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby.
- 24. Entire Agreement. This Agreement represents the entire agreement of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous written or oral agreements, negotiations, correspondence, undertakings and communications between such parties representing such subject matter.
- **25. No Consequential Damages.** Except as prohibited by law, each party hereto waives any right it may have to claim or recover any special, exemplary, punitive or consequential (including business interruption), or any damages other than, or in addition to, actual damages.
- **26. Headings.** The headings in this Agreement have been included solely for ease of reference and shall not be considered in the interpretation or construction of this Agreement.
